The Norfolk Autism Partnership was set up to respond to the Autism Act. It aims to help develop improved services for children, young people and adults who have, or who may have, autism.

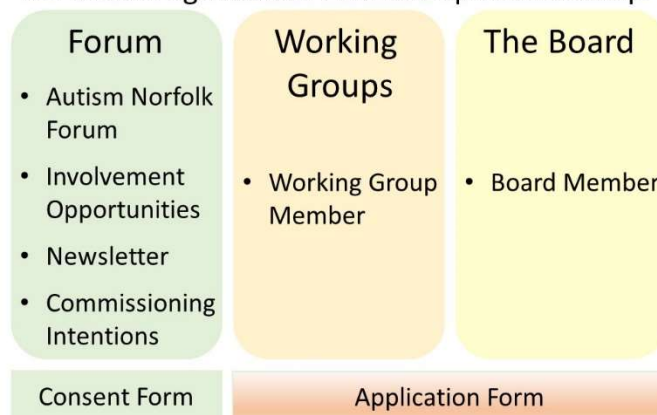
There are many different ways to get involved in the work of the Norfolk Autism Partnership:
