

Specialist Transforming Care Provision

Positive Behaviour Support



We are already training our care providers and specialist teams in Positive Behaviour Support.

In 2022 we will:

- Create a new positive behaviour support service
- This means 6 new specialist workers will support providers and families with behaviour support plans
- We will also pilot behaviour support training for families



Community Forensic Service



Community Forensic Teams work with people who have committed a criminal offence or who might offend.



We are creating a new specialist team to work with people in the community. It will start in 2022.



This will support people to leave specialist hospitals and prevent them from being admitted.

Intensive Support



Our intensive support teams work with people when they are at risk of admission to hospital.



We are expanding this service. 7 new team members will start in 2022. It will mean more people can be supported.



The team will provide specialist support to help people to live at home and in the community.

Short Term Support



We are creating a new short term support service. This will start in 2022.



It will support people to leave hospital whilst their long term home is organised.



It will also provide short term support if their care at home is at risk of breaking down.

New Supported Living Developments

Three year plan - more supported living



Norfolk County Council will invest in building more supported living homes (up to £18 million).



We want to build more than 180 new supported living homes in the next three years for people with learning disabilities, autism, mental health needs and physical disabilities.



We will work with other organisations to do this.

What is supported living



People are referred by their social care worker.



In supported living people usually rent their home.



They also have support to live as independently as possible.



If needed the support is intensive, with staff available on site 24 hours a day (it can be 1 to 1).

In other services, when people need lower levels of support, the staff might visit.

What is happening this year (2022)



There will be 13 new long term homes for people with the most complex needs.



We are working with partners to build 12 new homes in an 'enablement service'. This will support people to prepare for greater independence.



There will be 6 new homes for people moving on from 'enablement' services.



We will be working with partners to find sites for many more new homes in 2023 and beyond.
