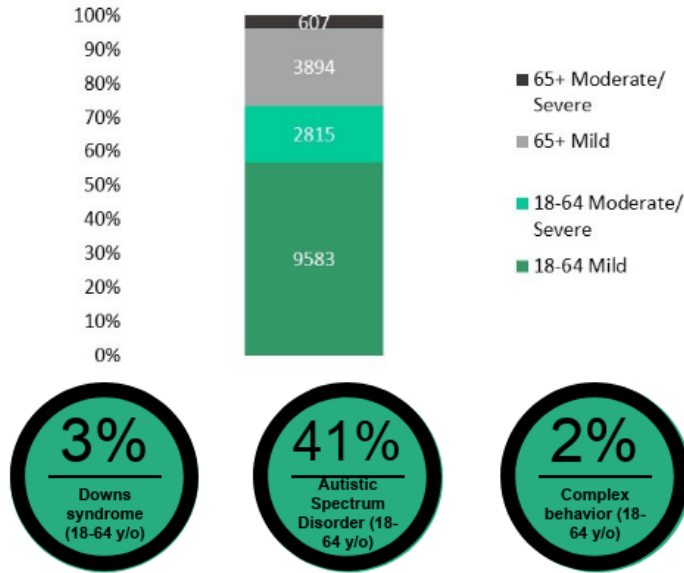
Why do we need a new Strategy?

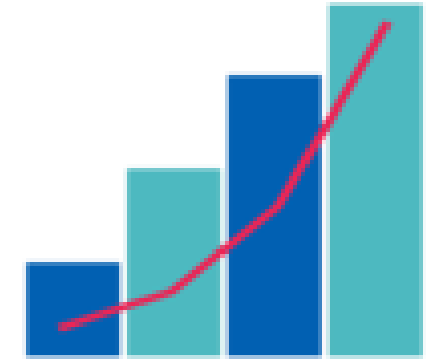

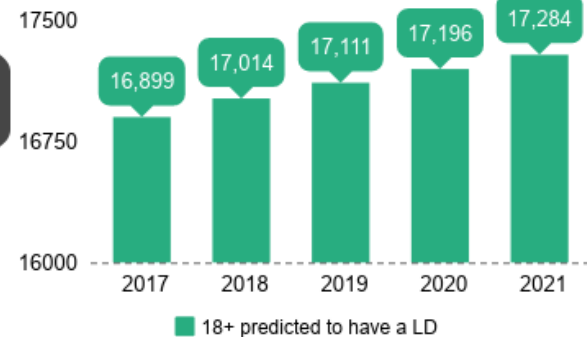
Predicted change - by 2021

17,284
Adults estimated to have a learning disability

385 or 2.3% more people over 5 year period (18+)

- The total number of people with a learning disability is expected to grow by 2.3% in the five years to 2021.
- The number of people with a learning disability in older age groups is growing faster than the average: in the same period the number of people aged 65+ with a learning disability will grow by 6.9%.

6.9% more people aged 65+ estimated to have a learning disability

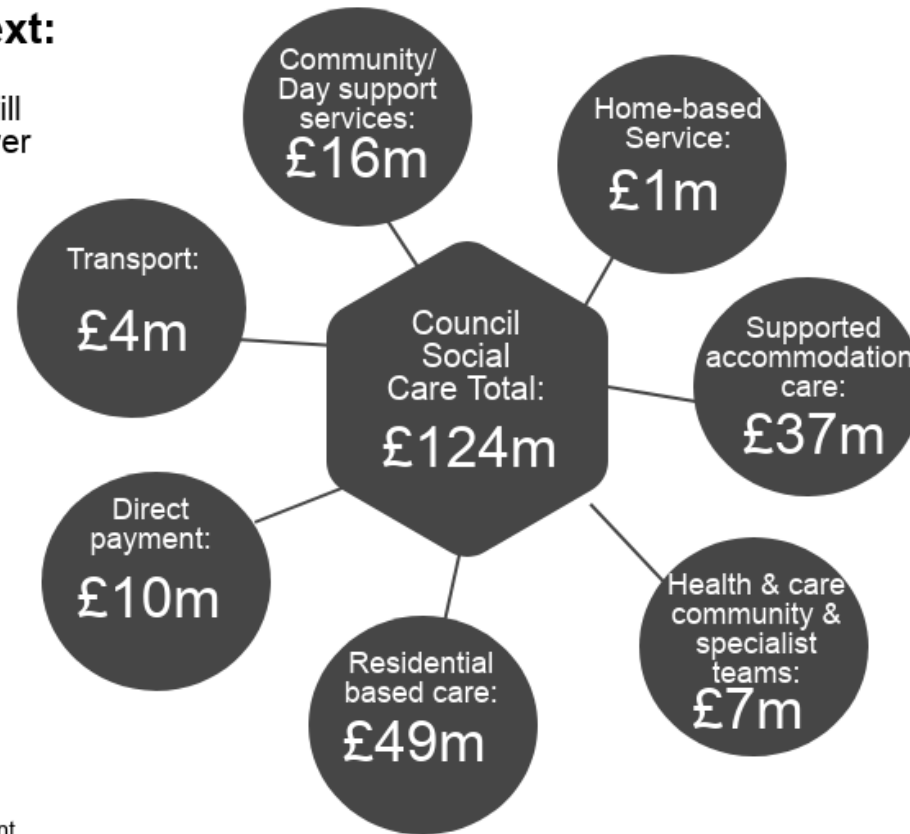

Co-Production

[My Life, My Ambition, My Future](#) co-production took place between July and December 2017.

People with experience of a learning disability, their families and carers, were central to the co-production. Professionals and the wider community were also involved.

In total, 823 people contributed to the [My Life, My Ambition, My Future](#) co-production listening and engagement activity. They did this in lots of different ways including surveys, group activities and a Co-Production Group.
