## From the Minister: Lest we forget

It was the war that was supposed to end all wars! Yet here we are in 2024 with numerous countries at war, though many go unreported; there are many new and much more dangerous weapons of mass destruction being used on a daily basis; there are also signs of rising fascism and reports and suggestions of ethnic cleansing, which is frighteningly reminiscent of the holocaust.

Lord, have mercy, when will it stop! Jesus came to teach us the way of peace and self-sacrifice. Remembrance is vital for all people and that remembrance must also spur us on to be bold peacemakers. The German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer said this: "Silence in the face of evil is itself evil: God will not hold us guiltless. Not to speak is to speak." I confess I am afraid to speak up and speak out about all that I see happening in the world and I feel helpless to act in any way that would help. I am not alone in this. So, what do we do? We turn to God and pour out our fears and anxieties and then wait patiently for God to guide and support us, which God does on a daily basis, thankfully.

In the meantime, our country will gather on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> of November in many different places and at different times and hold a 2minute silence to remember and honour the fallen then and now.

I recently read The Coffin Roads by Ian Bradley which reminded me that the old traditions were for a small number of people to walk many miles to a graveside for a funeral. It seems modern day life is looking for that simplicity once again as more and more people are choosing to forgo a church service and have a shorter graveside or cremation service for their loved ones. Many churches now offer an annual service to allow people to gather in their grief and spend time remembering their loved one in a short act of worship. Our linked charge is offering this service on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> November in Tarbert at 1pm, all are welcome.

### Worship going forward into 2025

The 5 churches in our linkage and union have enjoyed almost 2 years with weekly or twice monthly services. We are well served by the people who can cover these services and grateful to them for leading our worship. However, I would like to propose a small change to the times, I would like to ask both Tarbert and A'Chleit to change their time to 12 noon from January 2025 this will allow more time to be with the churches having the earlier service and still allow ample time to travel to the next church.

Also, in the last Church Chat, you heard that our finances are not good and we are using reserves to meet out costs. One of these costs is pulpit supply, which is £150 pounds for 2 services plus transport costs. As we need 5 services covered each month this is an expense that we need to review.

I am proposing to discuss how we might do the worship rota differently with each congregation. Over the next month I hope we can spend some time after worship to talk openly about what we would like and what we might do.

There are many options, continue as we are, change the number of Sunday's each church has for worship; invest in technology to allow services to be live via zoom in churches and people's homes; there are many other options that I am sure you can come up with and the more the better.

Please email me or speak to me directly when I am in your area and I will collate the responses and take them the Kirk Session, who have the final decision regarding worship.

Our neighbours in Mid Kintyre and Inverurie have gone down the route of reducing the number of services in each of their multiple buildings to 2 a month but they do not have an island! Some churches are using a TV to allow the Minister to be in each place each week. There are endless possibilities and we may need to try a few to see which works best for us. So please get your thinking caps on.

Inspection of Records

# **Spiritual Practice**

I hope last month's page gave you some food for thought. This month I want to introduce the Labyrinth. The Labyrinth has been around for millennia, it is a walk along a path with no dead ends, unlike a Maze. It has been used by Christians and other spiritual people in many ways and a variety of shapes and sizes are found all over the world.

I first came across it at The Bield, Retreat Centre near Perth. There is no right or wrong way to walk a Labyrinth. Last month I introduced the one in the picture below to the C3 Not the Guild Group. You can use it on the paper with your finger.

Simply place your finger at the opening at the bottom and slowly trace the path to the centre and then back out. As you enter let your mind empty of worries and be open to receive whatever God has for you. In the centre stop and listen or speak to God. As you retrace your path back to the start give thanks for this time with God. You can do this as often as you wish. Each time is different.

It is hoped to have a grass Labyrinth at the Old Clachan Hall at some point over the winter for people to walk. Watch this space for an update!



#### Harvest

Good News! The General Trustees have accepted one of the offers for the Manse. There are no conditions attached to this offer and an entry date of 31st October has been agreed.

McKinven and Colville have completed the necessary repairs to the electrics in the Church and Hall and 'satisfactory 'certificates have been issued.

Duncan McGregor has carried out an inspection of the roof space above the main sanctuary and we await his report and quote for the work.

#### **Gigha Church**

Final costings are awaited and the work is not likely to start until the New Year.

Recent electric bills have shown that the air source heating is very expensive so we will not put that in to Gigha at the moment. This will allow more money to go to urgent repairs.


#### **Skipness Church**
