LOCATION

University of Gdansk, Faculty of Languages, Neofilologia, ul. Wita Stwosza 51, room 023 (ground floor).

ACCOMMODATION

We have made agreements with the university and two hotels. These should cater to all tastes and budgets.

1) Central Hotel, ul. Podwale Grodzkie 4. 12-min ride on the train from the university campus. Website: <http://centralhotelgdansk.pl/en>.
