### Participation

- Deadline for participating **with** paper has expired. But until **the first of February 2019** it is still possible to sign up **without** paper-presentation.

### Send in preliminary full paper

- If you attend with a paper-presentation, you should submit a preliminary full paper (maximum 40.000-character spaces, references etc. included) **BEFORE 15th of February 2019**. Only English papers are accepted.
- In the symposium you will get comments from opponents and others as well.
- After the symposium we gather finalized papers in a forthcoming book anthology, expected to be printed in 2020 (on Routledge if everything turns right, going through a standard review process).

### Paper Presentation

- Each paper receives comments from two well-prepared opponents, but also from the audience. **The presentation may be in English or one of the Nordic languages**. Presentation-time: 30 minutes, then response from opponents and discussions.
- Be aware of sessions you chair (see program above). Also notice your opponent obligations. Be well prepared. All the abstracts and full papers will be distributed to all participants ultimo February 2919.
