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Call for proposals from the Nordic Summer University (NSU) for three one-year study programs (2 symposia) for 2022. Deadline: 5 January 2022

The board of the Nordic Summer University (NSU) is happy to announce our call for proposals for three 'ad hoc' study programs. We call these study programs "circles" to reflect the democratic core values that characterize our activities and it involves support for two symposia that will be part of the NSU's

a dozen such multidisciplinary winter symposia across the Nordic region and the Baltics as well as during a week-long combined session in the Summer. In 2022 the NSU summer session will be held close to Oslo in July. By joining NSU you will become part of a community of volunteers that has been organizing such symposia for a very long time across the region (this will be our 72th shared session).

We welcome your 'ad hoc' proposal in line with our goal to ensure the community remains open to new members and the new influences they bring. The proposals are selected based on NSU's objective to support "the development of emerging research initiatives and communities by fostering scholarly networks engaged in multidisciplinary enquiries, and to provide a space for conversations and exchange of ideas between diverse members of the Nordic-Baltic regions." While the symposia are held within the Nordic and Baltic region, we have many committed members who come from elsewhere. In this sense we also welcome proposals with a membership outside of the region. Our mandate means that we value unconventional contributions. We give financial and organizational support to circles that host symposium series that fall outside of established ways of working and thinking and/or have difficulties to be maintained within universities. We welcome everyone, including those that are academically inclined, dancers, inventors, teachers, and any interested and engaged individuals.

We are looking for new subject areas that fit into our existing program. In the recent past they have included urban studies, feminism, technology, race, human rights, artistic research, education, environment, comics, critiques of populism, welfare, migration and so on. More information is available at our website: <https://www.nsuweb.org/study-circles/> We expect you to contribute your research activities within the context of participating in our community and this includes our democratic process. We are a community governed by its members in a General Assembly that meets every summer session and together decides on the NSU study program for the next year(s). We warmly invite you to join this process in 2022, and consider sending in a three-year study circle application if you would be interested to do so.

The exact details on what we provide and ask, can be found on [nsuweb.org](https://www.nsuweb.org). In short: basic accommodation and travel expenses for participants are covered. For the summer session, travel expenses are covered for coordinators, and there are a limited number of grants and scholarships for low income or independent participants who would otherwise be unable to join, as well as travel support for people from Baltic and Nordic periphery regions. 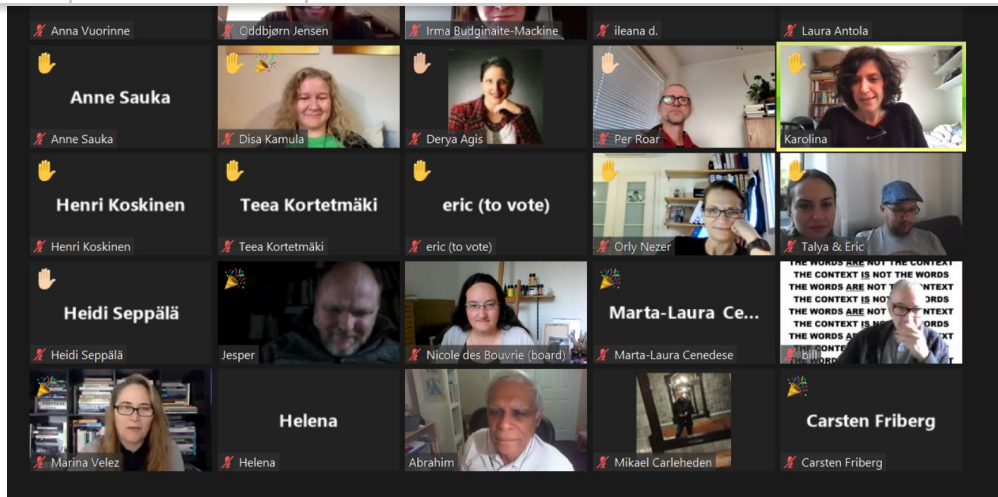
Call for Study Circle proposals 2023-2025
