Invitation Summer Session 2023

Summer is fast approaching and within NSU we are preparing for our 73rd summer session. This year we meet in Palanga in Lithuania between July 27 and August 3. Palanga is a sea-side resort located north of Klaipéda with its own international airport. We will lodge at Vyturys Hotel close to the beach. Study program 2023

NSU has a total of seven study circles, two one year circles and five ad hoc circles in its study program. Each circle is organised around a specific topic or field of research which the circle participants, together with the circle coordinators, invest and explore throughout a series of seminars, paper presentations and discussions. The symposia take place two times per year: in the winter and, during the week-long Summer Session. The Summer Session could be considered as the core event of the NSU since it is the only occasion when all circles are gathered on the same site. It is usually very appreciated among our members since it gives the opportunity to visit several circles during the same event. WHAT IS THE NSU SUMMER SESSION?



The week-long Summer Session is the yearly culmination of NSU's activities where all circles hold their symposia at a shared location, usually at a stunning location in one Nordic or Baltic countries. The program comprises of presentations, discussions, keynotes, workshops, readings, performances and a general assembly where every participant can take part in the democratic functioning of the organisation. There is also swimming, walking, and enjoying each other's company, and participants can bring their family. There is a children circle with activities for children aged 3-13.

PARTICIPATION

The costs of the summer session are as I follows:

How to apply and register for the Summer Session?

Once you have found a circle you would like to partake in, the next step is to write an application to the coordinators of the selected circle. You can find the current CFPs on the NSU website nsuweb.org, under the individual pages of the Study Circles.

Circle 1. Place of Heritage in Interdisciplinarity. Theme: Access to Cultural Heritage: Inclusivity and Development.

Circle 2. Cybioses – life in the future imperfect Theme: What a waste: surplus art, theory and tékhnē.

Circle 3. Praxis of Social Imaginaries: Cosmologies, Othering and Liminality. Theme: Racialisation, Objectification, Dehumanisation: Missionaryand Merchant in the Mongolian Empire.

Circle 5. Racialization, Whiteness and Politics of Othering in Contemporary Europe . Theme: Racialization, Whiteness and Politics of Othering: Alternative Futures.

Circle 6. Nordic Environmental Ethics. Theme: Climate Change and Welfare.

Circle 7. The Experiential in Artistic Practice and Research: Methods, Knowledges and Reflective Processes. Theme: Experiential Cognition in Artistic Research.

Circle 8. Futures of Education, Cultural Diversity, Imaginations and Collective Transformations in Time of the Anthropocene. Theme:

Action-Oriented Change – Potentialities for Sustainability.

One year circle 1. Political Myths and Critique in the Age of Post-Truth. One year circle 2. TBA.

Children Circle. Participants are welcome to bring their families and their children to the summer session. Children aged 3 and older will be supervised by youth leaders and a mentor while the parent(s) attend their study program during the day. A range of activities and free play opportunities will be available!

We encourage everyone interested to apply for the study program. The deadline for applications is **May 15th**, but please inquire with the study circle coordinators to see if there is potential to join later! There are no qualification requirements to receive an invitation to our activities and our symposia are usually visited by students, researchers, artists, and freelancers of all ages and with all kinds of backgrounds; both from within and outside of the academia. The Study Circles offer various options - either to present a paper, take part in a workshop, or even participate as a summer school participant (with a certificate included). Once you are accepted to the study program, you will automatically become a member of the NSU.

It is also important to note that during the Summer Session you can also visit other circles and join common or inter-circle activities - thus, any of the circle activities are open to you after ioining one of the circles. There is a social and

cultural program in the evening.

Prices for the Summer Session:

- - single rooms for 575 euros per person.
- - double/twin rooms for 425 euro per person.
- family rooms for 950 euros (family of 4).
- scholarship and grant recipient in a twin room: 175 euros.

The cost includes accommodation for the week, 3 meals and 2 coffee break a day, and access to the full NSU program during the summer session. Participation in the summer session requires NSU membership, and the cost also includes NSU membership. If you already paid the membership fee when you took part in a winter symposium in 2023, your membership is already covered for the whole year 2023. Please let the coordinators know so you can receive a discount code to deduct 25 euros from your payment. Those who can and wish to support NSU in addition to these costs are welcome to purchase an optional support fee of 40 euros. Those who cannot attend the summer session are also welcome to support the work of NSU by purchasing this support fee of 40 euros.

NSU Scholarship and Grant Program: Application Process

Those who wish to receive financial support to attend can apply for a scholarship (exclusively for Nordic/Baltic students) or a grant (inclusive for all other students and people in need, also non-Nordic participants). Please see the criteria and process to apply:
