Ongoing Formation Program: Oblates 5 ~ 10 years of priesthood

2008 gathering - Genjii no Mori (Ray & Nobu)

As to the program for the new priests, Ray had been asked to be the moderator, since Nobuhiko might not know what a priest's struggles are and Gen is younger than 2 of the new priests. Ray accepted, as long as he had the input of the other team members.

For a first gathering, we decided to have the three, Anselmo, Ken-ichi and Eduardo, meet with the formation team, prior to the annual retreat, at GENJI NO MORI, August 29, 2008, for a time of relaxation and input on the purpose of these get-togethers.

On August 30, we would move to Koga, and use our new annex, to have one or two inputs by the retreat master, with sharing among the members. They would attend the parish Eucharist the next day, followed by an evaluation, after which they would move to the retreat house for the annual retreat.

Evaluation:

It was felt that after the first gathering, it might be a good thing to let the participants prepare and choose the time and place of their next gathering, and also to choose the input person for facilitating their sharing.

2009 gathering - Yufu-in (Clement)

Since the younger Oblates did not feel that they were ready to go it alone, it was up to the committee to form the general outline. After an elongated discussion, we came up with the following. The gathering of the members would be prior to the annual retreat, to wit: August 29 (Sat) and August 30 (Sun). The place would be Yufu-in at the Sisters' convent. We opted to have the retreat master, Fr. Clement, as the facilitator for their meeting together.

Evaluation:

Our first item was to have the young OMI meet with us and talk about their experience a few days before at Yufu-in. Both Anselmo and Ken'ichi were present. Eduardo was absent so we had interviewed him earlier on in conjunction with other matters.

Overall we saw that the 3 men were unsatisfied with the overnighter they had. Their main complaint was that there was no definite plan and therefore they didn't know what

to do. In Eduardo's words, good sharing, but poor planning. Anselmo said he was tired from traveling here and since there was no plan it was not good. He felt lonely and like an orphan. Besides there was another group there which was boisterous, when they themselves were seeking a silent atmosphere. Overall he preferred the previous year when Nobu and Ray were present. Ken'ichi was tired from the hassle with the other group, having to search for the onsen and was not happy there was no clear-cut plan.

After the young OMI left the room, the team tried to identify the causes, and were surprised that the young men themselves could not plan their stay there.

At this point Clement, who had been their facilitator, joined the team and we heard his observations. The program had been left up to him. He centered on having them share about their reasons for joining the OMI. He thought that their sharing in that area was OK. His overall evaluation was that "they criticized the fact that they are treated like babies, but on the other hand they didn't seem to know how to organize themselves and therefore acted like babies." Our overall reaction was that they still needed to be spoon-fed!

Clement's suggestion was that all of them, in various degrees, need to be accompanied closely, or they will eventually drift away from the community and go on their own. He also thought that the frequency of their get-togethers should be increased from just a once-a-year affair.

Points for us to ponder as a team: the problem of accompaniment and how to go about it, and planning out next year's program.

2010 gathering - Koga (Sr.Gillis)

For this ongoing formation program the input person was Sr. Gillis.

Evaluation:

Kenichi: He said that he couldn't concentrate on the program due to his involvement in arranging for the retreat and other things. But on the whole he said that it was a good sharing.

Anselmo: He said that he benefitted from this year's ongoing formation program than the couple of previous ones. Sr.Gillis through her sharing was able to make us understand the two worlds - outside world and inside world; outer being and inner being. She was able to sort out my problems and difficulties. I was able to make

certain resolutions after the sharing. I liked the content from the sister even before the program, to get to know the participants, in order to arrange a good input.

Eduardo: He too said that this year's program was well arranged unlike the previous ones. And the inputs were solid from sister. He felt that it could have been better if an Oblate was there to guide them through out the program. The sharing he said made him look into his inner self.

Hiran: Participated in the program but was not present for the evaluation because of the language school.
