Questions for group sharing:

- 1. WHAT COULD HAVE BEEN DONE?
- 2. WHAT IF I STARTED OVER AGAIN AT THE AGE OF 40?
- 3. WHAT CAN WE DO NOW?

What could have been done?

- Could have been more sensitive to the Japanese culture and her values.
- Could have been developing more team-oriented ministries than oneman-show projects.

NB. Shocked by the fact that how unable to see the reality of what could have been done. Because, minds are full of what is done and unable to think beyond that.

What if I started over again at the age of 40?

- Set up a program like they have in Korea. Non-parish work.
- Korea's formation program has produced 6 new guys this year.
- More effort in preaching the gospel.
- Would emphasize kindergarten apostolate.
- Would not be bursar.
- Would get involved in prison work, a much-neglected apostolate in Japan.
- If everyone was 40, there would be a balance among ideas and projection of works, also support and challenging each other.
- Would create a scientific calculation system whereby we can judge our progress and make decisions based on facts.
- Would obtain a greater knowledge of the land, culture and thinking of people.
- Would recognize the gospel values existing in society and build gospel values on them.
- Missionary activity relevant to the times.
- Would prepare better my work in North Korea.
- Would stress teamwork, any project should involve at least two oblates, for support/continuation if one dies/etc.
- Would emphasize more work with young people, buy a van and travel around meeting people on their level.
- At 40, there would be no age gap, easier to communicate, etc
- Would go out of the parish and meet people.
- Trend: parishes decreasing in number therefore go out.
- Would clarify OMI identity for Japan in order to know why I am here.

- Would study and research how to use "mass-media" to communicate gospel values.
- Missionary means being sent to do a mission. What is my mission? I would encourage formulating a policy so that all would know what allowed before coming to Japan.

4. What can we do now? – Personal level, Community level & Regional level

Two groups answered this question.

Group 1:

What can we do in the next few weeks, few months? What can we do in the next 5-10 years?

- Personal level:

Group 2:
