On 22nd of May 2023, the European Network of Migrant Women (ENoMW), CAP Intl, SPACE Intl, Equality Now and the Swedish Women's Lobby are calling for the European Parliament to commit to a Europe free from prostitution!

On 8th of March 2022, the European Commission adopted a legislative proposal on combating violence against women and domestic violence, to enshrine minimum standards in EU law for criminalising certain offences and improving access to justice, protection and support for victims.

Following this important step, and as the text was passed to the European Parliament for revision and approval, the European Union Civil Society organised and mobilised to include the exploitation of prostitution of others as a form of violence against women tackled by the directive proposal.

In a resolution of 26th of February 2014, the European Parliament already recognised prostitution as a form of sexual exploitation. Today, as the Members of the European Parliament are working on a new initiative report on prostitution, we call for the upholding of this previous position in the upcoming texts - for women and girls in Europe to be truly protected.

Votes for both the directive on combating violence against women and the intiative report on prostitution will occur in the European Parliament's committees and in plenary session in the next few months. Women's rights organisations are more committed than ever to prostitution ensuring and pimping effectively tackled!

Women with a lived experience of prostitution, migrant & refugee women who make up the majority of victims of sexual exploitation. feminist experts and activists. platforms, and grassroot service providers will gather on 22nd of May for a series of actions.

THEIR STORIES

Julie Swede was appointed Director of SPACE international in January 2023. She works with an award winning project in Bristol called Bridging Gaps, enabling women with complex needs get better access to primary healthcare.

Julie's activism finds its root in her story: After a difficult childhood, Julie became a runaway and was groomed into prostitution at the age of 15. She got away from her pimp at 17, though he continued to terrorise her for years afterwards. She became hooked on heroin and continued to be exploited in prostitution until she finally could exit at 31.

Blessing Okoedion is a survivor of sex trafficking.

Now, she is using her own experience to raise awareness about sex trafficking as a form of violence against women and girls.

In 2019 she founded "Weavers of Hope" a non profit organisation in Italy with the goal to support women and girls trafficked from Nigeria for prostitution in Italy. She also travels through her home country, Nigeria , to help women and girls in disadvantaged and remote areas to identity traffickers and their strategies.

Blessing received a **Trafficking in Persons Hero Award** in 2018. In 2017, she published a book "**The courage of freedom**", co-written with Italian journalist Anna Pozzi, to tell her story and shine a light on this abhorrent practice.

I am Candida Alves and I am a survivor of prostitution.

I am 58 years old and half of my life has been violence, loneliness, suffering and misery. Today I am fighting for a Europe without prostitution. I know what I am talking about, and it's possible. I went from whore to social worker. With my life experience, I want to show everyone why there is an urgency to put on the agenda the total abolition of all types of prostitution.

There are women in total danger who are waiting for solutions to live in freedom.








"The fight against incest and prostitution are two sides of the same coin.

Almost every prostitution survivor I meet is an incest survivor. That's pretty telling. If we fight to protect these children, we must also fight for the adults they become."



Empower prostitution survivors, not their abusers."



In her youth, Julia was immerged in the world of prostitution and drugs for two decades, during the Soviet period of Ukraine and the fight for independence. In the early 2000s, breaking out of the vicious circle with great efforts, she started a new life and became a lawyer. She founded the first organisation of Ukrainian women with experience in prostitution. For 15 years she has been supporting women in difficult situations, which has become especially important now with the outbreak of war, when women are more vulnerable to this threat.

"The war has destroyed peaceful life of women in Ukraine. Over 7 million of women and children have become refugees in Europe. But this did not break us and we keep fighting for our rights. We must stop legalisation of prostitution in Europe!"






