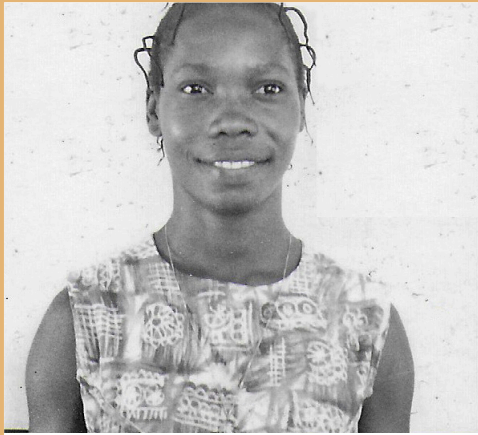
Happy birthday ma.

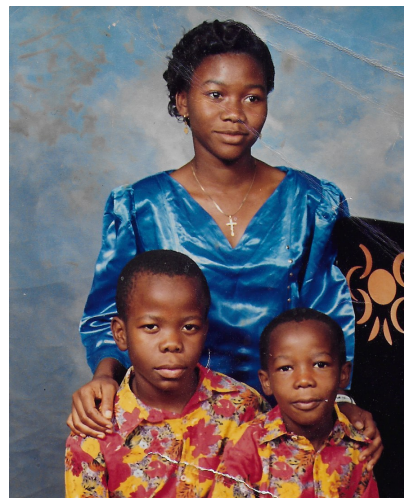

Where do I start, I guess with truth.

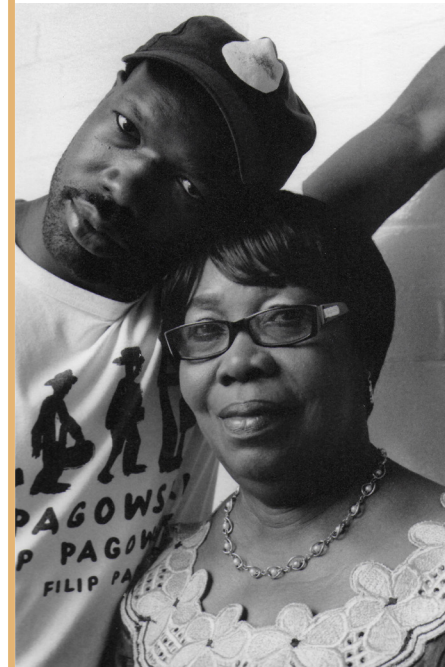

Biography

Our dear Mummy, Ruth Bosede Ojuluwayo, was born in Lagos, Nigeria on 20th March, 1949. She is the second child of late Mr Albert Ayodele and late Mrs Lydia Omosiwajuwa Ojuluwayo.

In 1954, mum started her education at St Mary's Convent Primary School in Lagos Island, and from there transferred to Our Lady of Fatima in Surulere, Lagos she where she finished her primary school education. She then attended the prestigious Methodist Girls' High School in Yaba, Lagos. Thereafter, in 1969, she proceeded to the Federal government labouratory, Lagos Pathology department where she began training as a medical laboratory technician.

In 1971, she proceeded to Britain where she studied for her A-Levels at Norwood Technical College in London. At the end of this course in 1974, she gained admission to study Dental Technology at Manchester Polytechnic. It was while she was at the polytechnic that she was blessed with her first child, a girl named Oluwatosin. As soon as she finished her course, she moved back to Nigeria in 1979 with her young daughter and subsequently got a job as a dental technician at the Dental School of the University of Ife (now Obafemi Awolowo University) where she lectured students on the technical aspect of dentistry. She was there for fifteen years, during this period she was blessed with two sons. Afterwards the University sponsored her to go back to Manchester to undertake a specialist technical course in Orthodontic and Maxillo-Facial Surgery Appliances.

Mummy was popularly known as 'Sister B' by her colleagues and students at University of Ife. Incidentally, one of her former students is today her dentist in London! It has been a great source of pride and satisfaction to her to see many of her students excelling in their chosen profession.

In 1993, she had the opportunity to move to Gurayyat in Saudi Arabia for one year to work as a dental technician. Upon her return, she relocated permanently to Britain with her children. She started working for Reed Nursing Agency as a Health Care assistant in Lewisham Hospital but after a short while, she realised that her skills and her potential were being under-utilised, she enrolled at Greenwich University to study Nursing and graduated at the ripe old age of 49. After qualifying as a registered nurse, our ever determined and hard-working Mummy made it her goal to climb the nursing ladder as quickly as possible. Thus, she proceeded to Birkbeck College of London University where she obtained a postgraduate diploma in Systemic Management and Consultation.

Thereafter, she got a job as a Challenging Needs Nurse at Springfield Hospital, London, transferring after a year to the Deaf Unit at the same hospital. Mummy went on to build a distinguished career as a well-trained and highly competent Nurse, working at a private hospital in Croydon, and then as a community nurse in Hammersmith and Fulham Community learning Disability team and also at Royal Hospital for Neuro-Disabilities in Putney, among others. Today she works at Ellern Mede Specialist Hospital for Eating Disorders, where she is well-known and very popular with both her colleagues and patients, who all refer to her fondly as Mama Ruth.

Mummy was brought up to know and serve the Lord, having attended The Salvation Army Church in Nigeria right from childhood. She attests that the Lord has been faithful to her in all walks of life, and she never ceases to sing praises to Him for all that He has done in her life to date. As a strong Christian and Bible believer, Mummy has also ensured that her four loving children and three grandchildren have continued in the faith.

On this occasion of her 70th birthday, we can give God all the glory and praise for Mummy's life, and we wish her many, many more years in good health and prosperity. May she continue to enjoy God's abundant grace and divine favour all the days of her life. Amen.
