Each role was played so realistically that it helped as move even faster to our objectives. After the scenario playing, again, in small sub-groups, we worked on different aspects of the problem. One group focused on practical solutions, and one group worked on the roots of the problem. At the end, we collected our findings, and matched the practical solutions to theoretical findings of the other group. This way we were able to generate a pathway.





Also, everyday after the end of our studying and activity sessions, we had a free time in which we could discuss the day either when walking in the nature or sitting down all together in the project house, until dinner time
