

## Terms of Responsibility (v1)

1. The European Committee (EC), as a sub-committee of the International Quidditch Association (IQA), will be responsible for the European Quidditch Cup (EQC), the annual club quidditch event of the European quidditch season. The EC will be responsible for the following parts of the EQC each year:

1.1. Selection of tournament location and dates

1.1.1. The EC will put forth bid requirements and will allow nations, cities, clubs, or other organizations a minimum of one month to submit their bid package

1.1.2. The EC will select a tournament location and dates through a democratic process that is representative of all nations who are members of the EC

1.1.3. The EC will publish a tournament location and dates for the tournament no less than 6 months prior to the tournament date

1.2. Selection of the Tournament Committee

1.3. Creation of deadlines, with input from the Tournament Committee for:

1.3.1. Submission of member teams to determine spot allocation

1.3.2. Team registration

1.3.3. Roster submission

1.4. Determining eligibility to compete at the European Quidditch Cup

1.5. Determining the number of teams to compete at the European Quidditch Cup

1.6. Overseeing finances of the tournament

1.6.1. The Tournament Committee will share a document with the EC to allow them to be up-to-date on the financial situation of the tournament

1.6.2. If there are expenditures exceeding 100 euros that have not been set in the budget ahead of time, the EC will be notified as soon as possible before the expenditure

1.6.3. If there is a deficit in the budget after the European Quidditch Cup, the EC will be responsible for paying back the deficit. Each NGB will be responsible for a portion of the deficit proportional to the number of teams they had competing in the tournament.

1.6.4. If there is a surplus in the budget after the European Quidditch Cup, the surplus will be returned to the EC for future events and expenditures

1.7. Overseeing tournament-specific policies

1.7.1. If a majority of 51% of the EC has doubts about or cannot see the benefits of any given policy set by the Tournament Committee, the EC reserves the right to question and

work with the Tournament Committee to reach a compromise that will satisfy both groups

1.7.2. If a compromise cannot be reached or if the majority of the EC is unhappy with the outcome of the compromise, a majority of 51% will result in the policy being vetoed

1.8. The EC will NOT be responsible for roster checks prior to the European Quidditch Cup. Individual National Governing Bodies will be responsible for the eligibility of their players.

2. The European Committee will be responsible for managing transfers between, and eligibility within, various European National Governing Bodies.

3. The European Committee will be responsible for development programs that are run exclusively within Europe

4. The European Committee will be a group for discussion between European quidditch nations
