

IMVEPI SECONDARY SCHOOL ARUA DISTRICT

Imvepi Secondary school is currently the only secondary in Imvepi Refugee settlement. The school was opened in March 2017. And the school was previously called Imvepi Self Help SS and it eventually closed when refugee repatriated back to South Sudan in 2006

Imvepi refugee settlement was opened in Feb 2017 and the school became operational the following month due to high demand for secondary education. The classes range from S.1 to S.4. Meanwhile S.4 students will sit their national examination this year in October.

The Current enrolment of the school stands at 704(nationals 43, Refugees 661) with an average weekly attendance of 301 (Nationals 24, Refugees 227). The school is community owned, supported by UNHCR through Windle International Uganda (WIU) which pays 12 teachers' salaries, 2 guards and 4 cooks. WIU also supports the school with instructional materials, text books, laboratory reagents and equipment, printing exams, paying for national exams, registration for final S.4 exams, co-curriculum activities, field study, paying for equating foreign documents to Ugandan standard among others.

The sponsored students are very happy and grateful for this rear chance and they promised to do their best in class for better results as the scholarship has given them hope in life and education. Currently, there are 422 pupils in P.7 who are potential S.1 students and may need the same support next. We therefore, appeal for more support next year.

Supporting students in skills training is a very viable option as it equips the youth with skills to earn a living. 2 more UAM will be identified by the school to fill the gaps left by the (2) S.4 girls who were not able to register for national examinations while the one taking care of the brother will return when the brother is discharged from hospital.
