"Participatory Guarantee Systems (PGS) are locally focused quality assurance systems. They certify producers based on active participation of actors and are built on a foundation of trust, social networks and knowledge exchange."

(revisited) Definition 2008

A Shared Vision - Participation - Transparency - Trust - Horizontality - Learning Proces



PGS – HOW DOES IT WORK?



- Actors to involve / Sharing a vision
- Agree and Document How the PGS Will Work: Collective identification of technical and social standards (beyond organic regulation)
- Farm visit: Map the Farm and Record Farm Details
- Report of farm visit
- Discussion (peer-review) of the report in general assembly
- Collective identification of advices to be brought to the farmers or seed savers for improvement
- Certification
- Exclusion mechanism
