Dear Friends

Just a note to say that I do hope you are enjoying the holiday weather and having some fine and fun times. I am not long back from a week in Inverness and a week in York and have had a totally chilled out time. The chill however does not refer to the weather as temperatures were pleasant in Inverness and regularly hitting 30 degrees in York where my sister and I could not contemplate leaving Brandy the cocker spaniel in the car while we shopped or visited museums and the like. Brandy had his own ideas, however, and, aware that York and Yorkshire were not new to us, had mapped out a fresh itinerary that was dog friendly and even allowed for his tasting a little ice-cream on a hot day.

I shall not share every detail of all we got up to but the name Rowntree featured in our adventures as we visited two parks and offices associated with the Rowntree foundation. Now I don't know about you but I have to confess that the chocolate produced by Rowntree and by Fry and by Cadbury presented some childhood delights. I could have wished that each park had a chocolate house serving ice-cream and chocolate sauce or hot chocolate or bars of chocolate or pastilles associated with Rowntree. However, there were other attractive features.

The first park that we encountered was near to the river. At first glance it did not over excite me and I found myself reflecting on the impression it would make on the vision of the great philanthropist and businessman and Quaker of York, Joseph Rowntree. Indeed, a couple walking their dog engaged in conversation and I shared my thoughts. Ah, they said, there is another perspective. We have had a very bad winter and all you view, at the moment, was under at least six feet of water in the month of March but volunteers have helped restore the ground as the park is used my many. I thanked them for sharing their story and we ventured further into the parkland where we walked round a lake with ducks on it and passed children's adventure playgrounds, and met families, dog walkers, and individuals some of whom were fleet footed, others with sticks, Zimmer frames, and some on scooters. And, there were plenty of seats and benches to sit on, and picnic areas too. We found an Italian Coffee Shop that catered for dogs and their friends. There were also some lovely gardens. I was glad to have met the couple who encouraged me beyond first impressions.

The next park was attractive too, and as the weather was hot, we were glad to find many leafy and shady trees. Each park advertised the community groups using it and all that was on offer. I also had a conversation with one of the Accountants. My mind sparked on our ecological project but if you would like to find out more, I encourage you to look up Joseph Rowntree and

the Foundation, or Joseph Rowntree A – Z. The vision is so engaging with good community outreach and involvement, and with love for the other. Recall the teaching of Jesus: Love one another as I have loved you.

Brandy also took us to the World Heritage site at Fountains Abbey. It was a good experience too, but it takes a lot to beat a good vibrant faith and a living Church! In Inverness, we found that, when we visited the Inches Church of Scotland, and we visited the Methodist Church in Tadcaster as we made our way north again.

Now, I am looking forward to the Sumner Fair on 24 August from 2 – 4pm. It should be an excellent day! Do come and bring your friends! Delighted also to hear of the number of people who have volunteered to help on the day. Thank you.

Throughout the summer various fresh initiatives are ongoing about which we hope to be able to give fuller information soon. We look forward to both an Appointment and Ordination of Elders, the welcoming of District Visitors, and to even more Magazine Distributors coming on board. There are many talents within our congregational life and we would welcome you offering yours. To all those about to volunteer and to all presently engaged, a warm and sincere thank you.

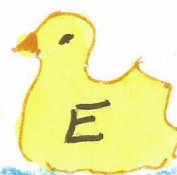
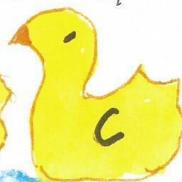
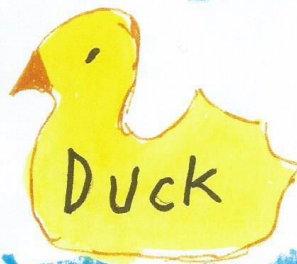

Blythswood Shoebox Appeal 2024



This year's shoeboxes are going to Ukraine. Blythswood is concentrating the shipment of shoeboxes to where the needs are greatest. This does present some practicalities as shipping to Ukraine is more costly and a lot stricter

than other shoebox destinations. Also, Blythswood have met with the folks in Ukraine and they advised they do not need baby shoe boxes. Last year 5% of all Tayside shoe boxes were baby boxes and this year, any baby boxes collected would need to go elsewhere and not to Ukraine. For the last few years we have been short of boxes for teens, boys and men. Please think of this when deciding who your box should go to.

Monetary donations are also welcome.

The plans for Perth this year are to launch the Shoebox Appeal with a coffee morning on Saturday 31 August 2024 at the Baptist Church.

We will need the shoeboxes by Sunday 27 October 2024. We will update you nearer the time with more details of these and any other events.

Notes:

- Offerings are 3% down on last year, for the first 6 months.
- The Christmas Appeal, made in December 2023, has raised £600 in the new year.
- The tax recoveries are for quarters up to end of March.
- Donations last year included £850 from the Ashton McKenzie Trust.
- The contribution from congregational organisations are from the Guild (£600), the Badminton Club (£380), the Country Dancers (£500) and Knit & Chat (£75).
- Hall lets are still ahead of last year, reflecting continued high usage at both Scone Old and New halls.
- Fundraising includes a coffee morning (£920), Bingo Tea (£1,201), Country Dance (£274), Hot Dog Movies (£177) and Quiz (£250).
- Other income is a grant from Perth and Kinross Council (£250) plus half yearly interest and dividends (£2028).
- We have incurred a deficit of £7416 for the first half of the year, due to significant increases in some costs, particularly our Giving to Grow contributions and Heating and Lighting costs.
