Hello Maurizio,

Sorry for some delay in answering you, but it takes some time to find the correct documents!

The AGA regulator you are asking about was part of a breathing apparatus used by the Swedish Armed Forces in the 60 ties.

The manual came out in 1962 and this version is basically the same version but from 1969. SPL from 1962.

It was nicknamed the "Horned Mine" since the regulator had so many "things" protruding from it. Also the breathing valve was nicknamed the "tea strainer" since the metallic cover over the exhalation membrane looked like a tea sieve!

Unfortunately we only have these manuals in Swedish, and I would love to have them in English if they were ever translated?

But today with "Google translate" or a similar program you might be able to get the text translated.

The description describes the "apparatus" and how it works including accessories and you also have the "spare part list" depicting all parts in an exploded diagram form.

Hope that this is what you were asking for?
