You will recall that the Senior Tigers recently donated a gift to **Wishh** and the following article, which appeared in the Hull Daily Mail, shares how things are progressing.

Staff fighting on the frontline of the <u>coronavirus</u> <u>pandemic</u> will be boosted by a new health and wellbeing facility at <u>Castle Hill Hospital</u> thanks to a huge number of donations. Money donated by members of the public, as well as businesses and charities, during the pandemic means a designated area for the hard-working staff to relax and unwind can be created.

The £130,000 facility has been part-funded by the charity WISHH (Working Independently to Support Hull's Hospitals) which welcomed donations from <u>Hull Live</u> and Hull Daily Mail readers. (and, of course, Senior Tigers)

Staff at both Castle Hill and Hull Royal Infirmary showed tremendous dedication and courage

when treating seriously ill patients during the low points of the pandemic and are expected to be called upon again as case numbers begin to rise once more. The aim is for Hull Royal to also have a facility built, following on from the first phase at the Cottingham site.


