We then went to The Dambusters Arms at Scampton. Another area of current interest is anything pre-1946. Any wartime football items involving City and anything pre-war Tigers is what we are looking for. Programmes, newspaper cuttings and memorabilia. We did appear in a FA Cup Semi Final (1929/30) and gain promotion (1932/33). Plus, some great players represented the club. We believe there are items hidden away in homes, attics and garages round the region. As we enter 2021, I invite you to take a look at the Senior Tigers web site and view a programme from 100 years ago. I am sure you will find it interesting. To find the programme go to the Senior Tigers web site, click on "HULL CITY MEMORABILIA", click on "ENTER GALLERY", click on "Match Programmes", search and click on "1920-21" (coloured green), look for 05/03/1921 (again coloured green) and click on. You will now be able to read the programme for the home game against Preston North End and see a glimpse into life in Hull 100 years ago.

In addition to the football notes and information take a look at the adverts. One could visit The Lyric, The Grand Theatre, The Tivoli or Alexandra Theatre for a night out. Or may be go for tea at the Grosvenor Hotel. You may be dressed in clothes from Lion Clothing Co Ltd, Asbestos or Waistell & Co. You may have picked up a bargain from Ward & Abercrombie. To get home you could have taken a taxi from Hull City Motor Carrying.
