Memorabilia Team article: The TRAP DOOR!

If you browse through the Match Information on the Memorabilia part of the web site you will notice that over the years a number of clubs have names you don't recognise or whom you had forgotten about. These unfamiliar names may be clubs who have disappeared or have had troubled seasons and find themselves in Non-League football. What surprised me is the number of clubs that have fallen through the "trap door".

Whilst our local rivals Grimsby Town have sadly dropped out of the League, we should be pleased that we have not suffered a similar fate. We applaud our teams for achieving promotion or outstanding cup results but we should not forget that great effort is needed at times to avoid adversity. "The Great Escape" season of 1998-99 was just one of those times. How scary was that season as we occupied the bottom 2 places in Nationwide League Division 3 from 3 October 1998 to 13 March 1999. We could easily have been one of those clubs falling out of the Football League. Many will remember the 13,949 who crowded into the crumbling Boothferry Park to witness the 1-1 draw with Scarborough as Gary Brabin's goal moved us towards safety. Take a few minutes and visit the web site to look at the match detail and the programme and remind yourselves of the team of heroes who staved off disaster. We should also not forget the times of near extinction when Administration and Liquidation were possible. Who knows what would have happened then?

Since 1905-06, our first season in the FL we have played the following clubs who are no longer in existence or who are surviving in Non-League football.

No longer around are, Burton United, Nelson, Wigan Borough, New Brighton and Bury. Now playing in Non-League are, Aldershot, Bradford Park Avenue, Chester City, Chesterfield, Darlington, Gainsborough Trinity, Gateshead (formerly South Shields), Glossop North End, Halifax Town, Hartlepool United, Hereford United, Notts County, Scarborough, Southport, Stockport County, Torquay United, Workington, Wrexham, and York City,

Some clubs changed their name, now we know what arguments that can cause! Clapton Orient (now Leyton Orient), Leeds City (now Leeds United), Leicester Fosse (now Leicester City) and Rotherham County (now Rotherham United).

There are many other cubs that have disappeared that City never played in the FL. Bet you never knew some of these towns even had a football club. A couple of the clubs played in the old Third Division South, whilst City spent many years in the Norther Section. Changes were made in 1958-59 season with the introduction of Divisions 3 and 4. These clubs are, Aberdare Athletic, Ashington, Bootle, Burton Wanderers, Darwen, Durham City, Loughborough, Merthyr Tydfil, Middlesbrough Ironopolis, Northwich Victoria, Stalybridge Celtic and Thames.

You will not find the above names on our web site but they do show that football has played a major part in the social history of the country as both past and present clubs cover the whole country. One of the aims in building our memorabilia section is to record the part played by the Tigers in the social history of our region.

Lastly, we are nearly there in our quest for promotion. WELL DONE Hull City players and staff, you have gone a long way in redeeming yourselves after last years disastrous season. No matter what position we finish in, the season will go down in history as being very successful and the one we scored a record number of away wins & away goals. It will be most remembered for the season no fans attended games. Fans in future will look at the heritage and history of clubs and wonder how we survived and kept up our support.
