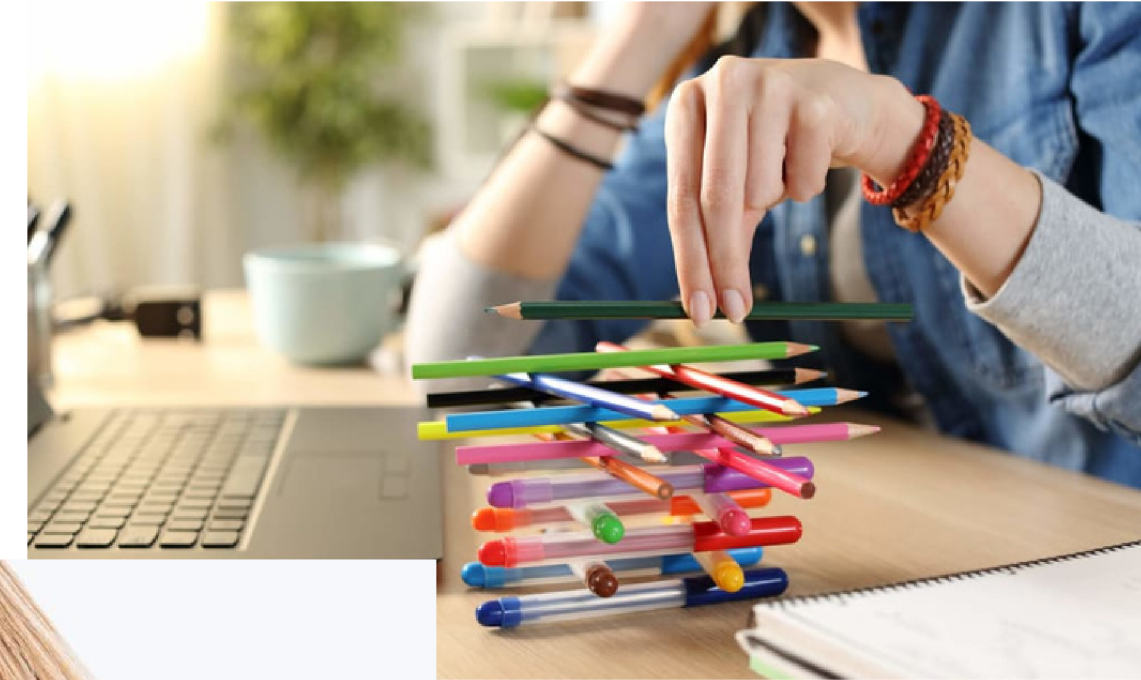
▶ Importance of Managing Diverse Learning Styles

Challenges in Virtual Classrooms:

- Use a variety of teaching methods and materials to reach different learning preferences.
- Encourage student participation and feedback through online discussion forums, chats, and video conferencing.
- Be aware of the different learning styles within the class and make adjustments as needed.



Challenges in Virtual Classrooms:

- **Offer opportunities for self-directed learning, allowing students to choose the materials or activities that suit their learning style.**
- **Use multimedia and interactive tools to engage students with different preferences.**

▶ **Customised lesson plans**


Create customised lesson plans by assessing your students' language proficiency levels and identifying their specific language goals.

For instance, if you have a group of intermediate learners, you might tailor lessons to reinforce their grammar skills and expand their vocabulary, while advanced learners may focus on fluency and discussion of more complex topics.

Interactive and engaging materials

Utilise interactive online platforms, such as interactive whiteboards, virtual breakout rooms, and digital flashcards.

For instance, for a lesson on vocabulary building, you can use an interactive whiteboard to engage students in word-matching exercises, allowing them to drag and drop words to their corresponding meanings.

Traffic light assessment 

Indicate whether you understand a topic or not. Add a colored sticker **over** every number of a statement.


Add:

- 6 I can reach a judgment in my conclusion.

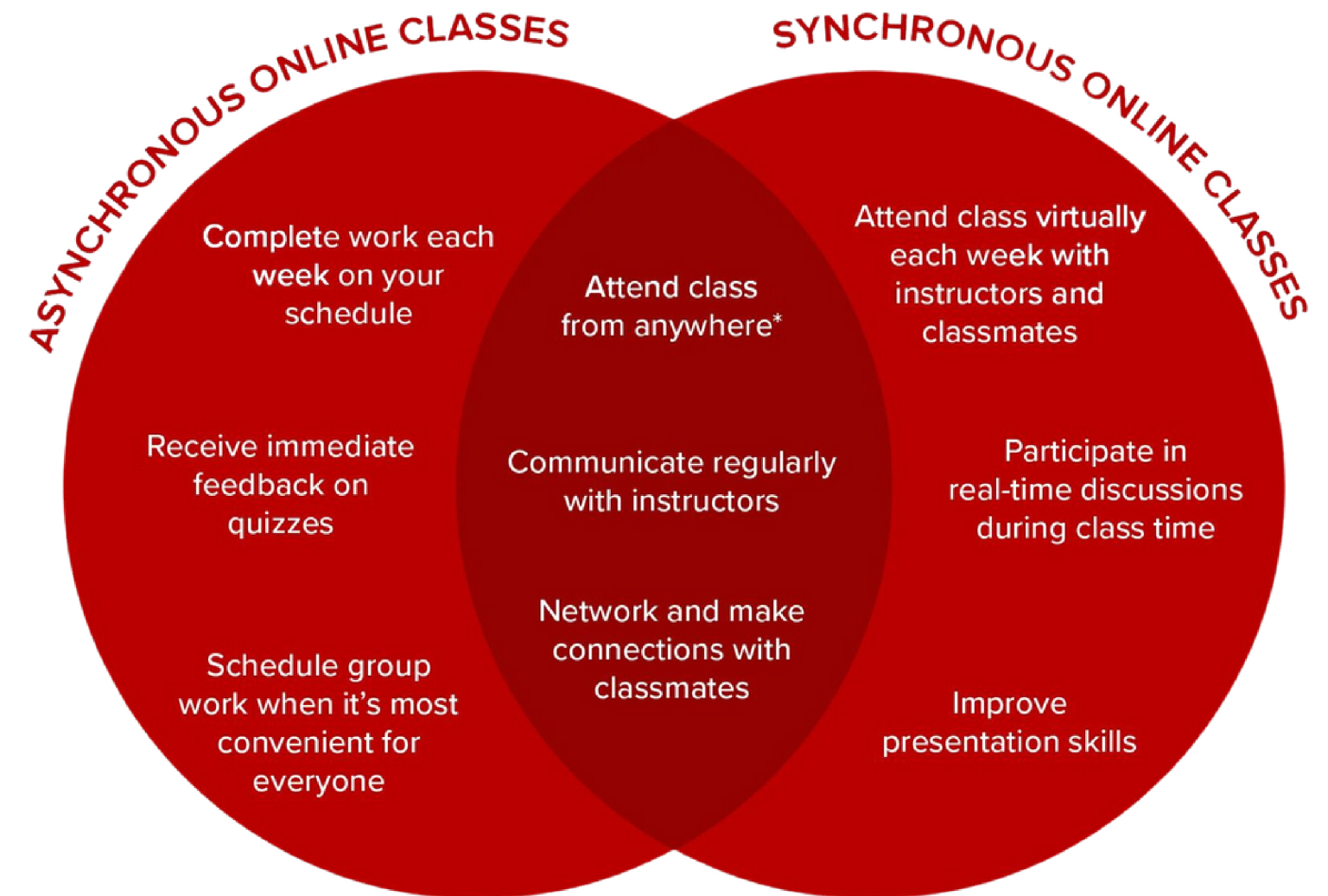

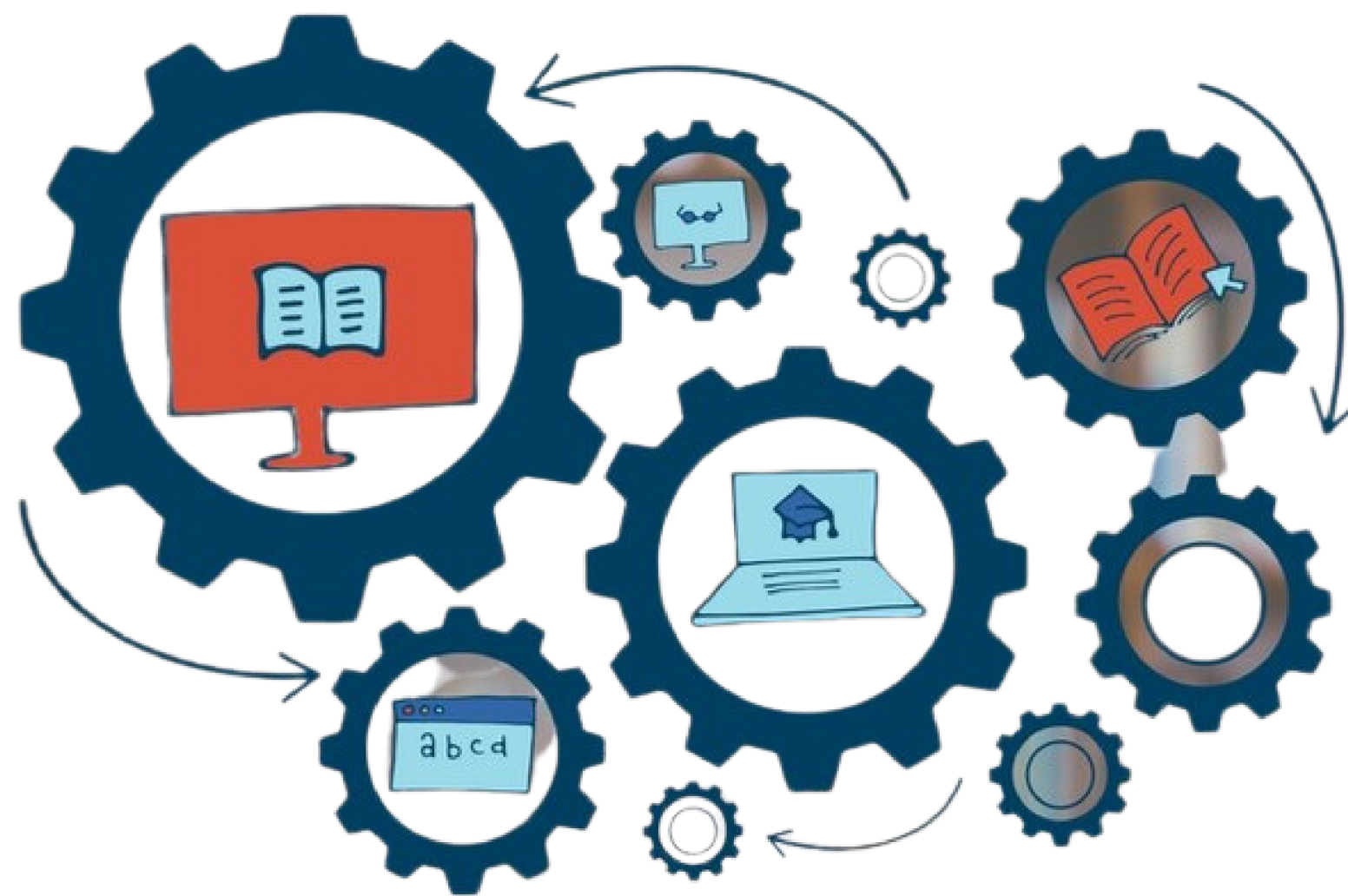
Synchronous and Asynchronous Learning

Recognise the benefits of both synchronous and asynchronous learning. For asynchronous learning, you can create pre-recorded video lessons that students can access at their convenience.



Adaptive Learning Resources

Incorporate adaptive learning tools and resources, like language learning apps with adaptive algorithms.



Ongoing Feedback and Goal Setting

Maintain regular communication with students through individual meetings or email to provide personalised feedback on their progress. Encourage them to set specific language proficiency goals and work with each student to outline steps to achieve those goals.
