



## Easter 2022 Playscheme Report

This Easter 2022 school holidays we ran our playscheme 3 days a week for 2 weeks (Tuesday – Thursday each week). We had capacity to enable up to 40 children to attend each day, except Kingswood where we could accommodate 30 children per day.



We delivered 1 session per day per location for 4 hours as this has worked well over the past few years. The sessions included arts and crafts, sports and games. Every child received a free cold lunch which included wraps, falafels, cucumber sticks, celery sticks, humous, fruit and cheese and marmite swirls which was brought in from Snack Attacks in Patchway.

We try and use local organisations for anything we bring into the playscheme, and we believe it is important to support local organisations.


We had 274 different children attend across the following locations:

- Patchway – 81
- Kingswood – 72
- Yate – 78
- Barton Hill (Wellspring) – 43


These 274 children attended a total of 713 times (average of 2.6 days per child). Below are some graphs showing the statistics for the children who attended.



number of children on free school meals




Ethnicity





- 56 children who attended had additional needs. For these children, we provided a pop-up tent, ear defenders and fiddle toys to enable them to participate in activities as well as having somewhere



quiet / safe for them to go if things were a bit overwhelming. These items really helped settle in the children, especially as it can be very noisy with so many children.

- 33% of the children who attended were BAME.
- 72 families who attended are living in poverty.
- 36 children who attended had poor mental health.

We brought in Bristolian Productions to deliver sessions around circus skills and Chris at Puppets Online put a puppet show on then the children made their own puppets later in the day at Patchway, Yate and Kingswood. In Barton Hill, we had the STEM ambassadors come in and help the children build and control a Lego robots.
