I'm too old to be a foster carer



FA(T

There is no upper age limit for foster carers. The minimum age is 21.



I must be in a relationship to foster



FA(T

Foster carers can be single, married, in a civil partnership, divorced or widowed.



I need to own my home to be a foster carer



FA(T

Foster carers can rent or own their home. This can be a flat or a house.



I can't foster because I'm not a parent



FA(T

Foster carers don't need to have their own children. However, if you have some experience with children this can be beneficial.



I can't be a foster carer because I work full-time



FA(T

Foster carers can work full-time, part-time, be retired or unemployed.



Fostering is voluntary



FA(T

Foster carers receive weekly allowances for the child and a weekly fee payment for their skills. Fostering payments shouldn't affect you claiming benefits or any benefits you already receive.
