Drugs: the facts

Did you know?

- Cannabis is a class B drug.
- Cocaine is a class A drug.
- Ecstasy is a class A drug.
- Heroin is a class A drug.
- Heroin is extremely addictive, and the body soon gets used to it so needs more and more to get an affect.
- Heroin can kill especially when mixed with alcohol.
- Spice (synthetic cannabis) is a class B drug.
- Since 2016, the Psychoactive Substances Act has made 'legal highs' illegal.
- There were 3,060 deaths in 2020/21 due to drug poisoning; 840 involved cocaine and 2,219 involved opiates.
- There were 17,752 hospital admissions due to poisoning and 7,294 due to drug induced mental health issues.
- 3 million people in the UK aged 16 to 59 used a class A drug in 2021/22.



Drugs and your health

- All drugs have a psychological and physical effect on the body.
- Drugs cause anxiety, depression, increased heart rate and high blood pressure leading to breathing difficulties and ultimately death.
- They also cause paranoia, impair memory, appetite, and sleep patterns.
- Drugs can lead to various forms of cancer, especially lung cancer if smoked.
- Mixed with alcohol, cocaine and or heroin can be extremely toxic and lead to death.
- Naloxone can be supplied by SIAS. You or your partner/family should be shown how to administer it in the event of overdose.

Drugs and the law

- Possession of class B drugs can lead to five years in prison.
- Supply can lead to 14 years in prison.
- Possession of class A drugs can lead to seven years in prison.
- Supply can lead to life in prison.
- So called legal highs are not actually legal and are aimed at children due to their availability and are designed to appeal to children.
- Driving while under the influence of drugs can lead to imprisonment, a ban and heavy fine.
