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

Allington socks

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SIZE

36/37 38/39 40/41 46/47 48/49

Instructions are for smallest size, with changes for larger sizes noted in different colors. When only one figure is given, it applies for all sizes.

MATERIALS

REGIA PREMIUM Merino Yak, 100 g ball

Col. 07510 (beige meliert) 1 ball Double pointed Needles size 2.5 - 3.0 mm 1 tapestry needle for weaving in ends

BASIC PATTERN

Ribbed pattern: p2, k2 tbl, repeat to the end.

Stockinette stitch:

In Rows: RS: knit all sts, WS: purl all sts.

In Rds: knit all sts.

Cable pattern:

Multiples of 12 st: work according to the chart.

The numbers to the right of the chart indicate the odd-numbered rounds.

In the even-numbered Rd, work the st as they appear, or as described in the legend.

Work the 12-st repeat to the end of each round.

Repeat **Rds 1 - 12**.

GAUGE

Stockinette stitch, size 2,5 - 3.0 mm needles:

 $30 \text{ st and } 42 \text{ R/Rd} = 10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$

Cable pattern, size 2,5 - 3,0 mm needles:

 $32 \text{ st and } 45 \text{ R/Rd} = 10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$

If your gauge differs from the given gauge, use needles of a larger or smaller size accordingly.

INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 60/60/64/72/72 st, divide evenly over 4 needles and join to work in the round (= 15/15/16/18/18 st on each needle). For the cuff, work in ribbed pattern for 4 cm. Then continue working the leg shaft in the cable pattern, size 40/41: k2tog on each needle in the first cable pattern needle = 60 st. After 12,5 cm = 56 Rd for the cuff, work a

boomerang heel over the 30/30/36/36 st on Needles 1 and 4, following the tutorial "Knitting Socks with a Boomerang Heel.", size 40/41: make 1 st from the bar in the center on Needle 1 and 4 in the first Rd = 32 st. Stitch division for the boomerang heel: 10/10/10 10/10/10 10/12/10 12/12/12 12/12/12 st.

Work 2 Rd of the boomerang heel over all st: knit the st on Needles 1 and 4 in stockinette st. knit the st on Needle 2 and 3 in cable pattern.

After completing the boomerang heel, continue working over all stitches: on Needle 1 and 4 (= upper side) stockinette st, on Needle 2 and 3 following the cable pattern, and purl 1 st from the back loop of the bar before the first st on Needle 2 and after the last st on Needle 3 = 62/62/64/74/74st (= 15/15/16/18/18 st on Needles 1 and 4, 16/16/16/19/19 st on Needle 2 and 3)

When the foot measures 18 /19,5/20,5/23.5/24 cm, work 2 Rd more over all 62/62/64/74/74 st, in the 2nd Rd purl the first 2 st and the last 2 st on Needles 2 and 3 together. Don't work this decrease on size 40/41 = 60/60/64/72/72 st.

Now work stockinette st over all st and start with toe decreases, following the tutorial "Knitting Socks with a Boomerang Heel."

After the 1st decrease round, repeat the toe decreases as follows: once in the following 4th Rd, 2x in every following 3rd Rd, 3/3/4/4 x in every 2nd round and /6/7/8/8 x in every Rd.

FINISHING

Thread the working yarn through the 8 remaining stitches and pull to close.


Weave in the end.

Work the second sock in the same way.

ABBREVATIONS

k = knit p = purl RS = right side st(s) = stitch(es) WS = wrong side

KEY

= k1

- = p1

= cross 2 st to the left (= k the second st through the back loop behind the 1st st without allowing the st to slide off the needle; then k the 1st st and slide both st onto the right-hand needle).

= cross 2 st to the right (= k the 2nd st before the 1st st without allowing the st to slide off the needle; then k the 1st st and slip both st onto the right-hand needle).
