
#### Winters - Past and Present


In the same way some of us experienced and still remember the winter of 1962/3! The snow began to fall on Boxing Day and did not melt until the end of March!

#### **Country Car Scheme Update**

DCC have decided we can now take passengers to and from hospital appointments as well as visits to the doctor, dentist, optician, visiting patients, etc. At least 24 hours notice would be appreciated although attempts will always be made to help in an emergency. It is not possible to carry anyone who cannot get in and out of the car on their own and volunteers are not equipped to handle wheelchairs. All journeys are dependent on a driver being able and willing to give up their time. Passengers are expected to pay the driver 30p per mile and will be given a receipt. Volunteer drivers are paid 45p a mile for trips of up to 50 miles. DCC will make up the difference to the driver. #### **Parrett & Axe Parish Council**

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> November 2012. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish website (<a href="www.parrettandaxe.org.uk">www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</a>) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, County Cllr Rebecca Knox, District Councillors Janet Page and Caroline Payne, and PCSO Alex Bishop were also in attendance.

- ❖ Beaminster Tunnel Dorset County Council's Cabinet had met to discuss two options. Option 1: soil nailing techniques, and Option 2: reinforcement of the entrances with concrete saddles and to erect hoods on each end of the tunnel. Option 1, soil nailing was agreed as investigation of the slopes found this would offer the safest and the most enduring solution to the problem of slope stability on and around the tunnel. It will also include reinforced concrete saddles over the tunnel entrances and reinforced sides. This option will enable the earliest reopening. It was hoped that work would start at the end of the year and efforts were being made to obtain national funding for this project.
- ❖ A356 Variable Message Signs The problems caused by oncoming traffic in the narrow section of road between Swing Gate Cottage and The Old Rectory wall has been an on-going problem for many years. This has become more acute since the footway and wall curbs were installed and Donald Hargreaves, resident of Sarum reported that the number of HGVs getting jammed outside his property was on the increase. Matthew Williams of DCC Highways has suggested the use of Variable Message Signs (VMS) which could be set to alert oncoming drivers to a large vehicle already in the narrow section of the road. The signs, which would be solar powered, would cost in the region of £15,000. Members expressed an interest in principle and it was agreed that Matthew Williams would be invited to attend an extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council to explain in greater detail how the signs worked (Matthew will now be attending the meeting on 10<sup>th</sup> January 2013).

#### **❖** A356 – Further Issues

- o There is a problem with flooding in the dip on A356 on Crewkerne side of South Perrott.
- There are potholes and damage to the road surface outside Maple Cottage.
- The cat's eyes had still not been fitted along the road by the former Golf Club (the Clerk has now been advised by DCC that they do not intend to replace them).
- The kerbstones alongside Swing Gate Cottage were damaged and causing a noise nuisance to the owners of Swing Gate.
- Surface water frequently runs across the road by Hunters Hatch.

The Clerk advised that she had reported these issues to DCC Highways.

- ❖ Lecher Lane turning Richard Stubbs of DCC Highways had attended a site meeting to discuss damage to Shire Cottage roof, caused by HGVs attempting to turn right into Lecher Lane. He advised that a Traffic Regulation Order to limit HGVs would not be appropriate. Richard would arrange for "Unsuitable for HGVs" signs to be erected at each end of Lecher Lane and for the "Mosterton" sign to be removed from the finger post at the junction. In addition, three 3m high black and white poles with reflective tops would be placed behind the kerb line where the damage has occurred.
- ❖ Speed Checks The Police were continuing to conduct speed checks in South Perrott but the camera van team was finding it difficult to site their vehicle.

- \* Refurbishment of the Pound reported on front page.
- ❖ Waste Collection (Dorset Waste Partnership) In April 2013 all waste collection staff will become DCC employees. In April 2014 the waste collection timetable will change to fortnightly collections of general waste with weekly collections of food waste. Wheelie bins will be available.
- ❖ Community Farmers Snow Plough Scheme The Snow Plough Scheme being promoted by DCC was discussed. It was suggested that as DCC is responsible for clearing the main road and local farmers generally clear the side roads to their farms, this would account for most of the roads in the parish. Therefore it was agreed that it will not be necessary for the Parish Council to join the Farmers Snow Plough Scheme. Cllr Knox suggested that all the grit bins in the two villages should be regarded as 'strategic'. The Clerk will write to DCC Highways and also request a replacement dumpy bag of grit.
- ❖ Dorset Country Cars Scheme The Clerk reported that she and Joyce Osborne had attended a Country Cars meeting at DCC (see Joyce's article).
- ❖ Parish Website Dave McSkelly has kindly agreed to undertake the task of keeping the parish website up-to-date.
- ❖ Pipplepen Lane has been closed for several months due to flooding under the bridge. The Clerk will contact Somerset County and North Perrott Parish Councils to progress reopening the Lane.
- ❖ Queen's Diamond Jubilee Trees for Dorset A commemorative tree will be planted on the Millennium Green on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2012.
- ❖ Footpaths Footpaths Officer, Dominie de la Poer, agreed to remind Jill Exton, Rights of Way Officer, that repairs are needed to the section of wall that has fallen into the river along Langmoor Lane bridleway.
- ❖ Approval of Budget and Precept for 2013-2014 Following discussion, members agreed a Precept of £3,800 and this decision will be ratified at the January meeting of the Parish Council.
- ❖ Planning Applications 4 Applications have been handled since the last Parish Council meeting. The planning application for residential development of two semi-detached properties on land adjacent to Picket Lane has been withdrawn.
