South Perrott and Chedington Millennium Green

The Millennium Green Trustees and Committee members were delighted that the Millennium Green was chosen as the site to plant the Wild Service Tree donated to the parish by 'Trees for Dorset'. This is to commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and the planting took place on 30th November 2012. The photo opposite shows the tree being planted by Tony Warne from Trees for Dorset and the Millennium Green Trustees, Bob Buckland and Peter Hinton. A brass plaque will be mounted alongside the tree.



Fundraising Event - The Millennium Green costs nearly £1000 a year to

maintain and income is derived solely from private benefactors and fundraising activities. A356 Road Scheme Variable Message Signs

Matthew Williams, Manager, Network Traffic Control, DCC Highways, attended the Parish Council meeting held on 10th January 2013, to present his proposals for tackling traffic flow through the narrowest part of South Perrott, by Swing Gate Cottage. He proposed that Variable Message Signs (VMS) were installed at each end of this narrow section. These will be triggered, when a large vehicle enters this section, to warn traffic coming from the other direction. These illuminated signs will have a "road narrows" symbol above with suggested wording, "Oncoming Vehicle in middle of road". The two signs will be linked by radio and will be solar powered. Matthew Williams reported that VMS had been used successfully in the north of the county. VMS are advisory signs and it is not mandatory for traffic to stop. An alternative type of sign reading "HGV approaching, please wait here" would be considerably more expensive and take longer to provide as it would need Department of Transport permission. The proposal for Variable Message Signs was accepted with a request for installation as soon as possible. A site meeting has been arranged between Matthew Williams and councillors to agree the most appropriate positions for the VMS. Matthew's plans are displayed on the Parish notice board in The Pound.

Superfast Broadband

The government is providing £18m as a contribution towards the funding of a Superfast Broadband infrastructure in rural areas by 2015. This will provide a minimum of 2 Mgb/s in areas currently without broadband and over 24 Mgb/s in areas already with broadband. The money will help to bridge the funding gap in those areas where it is uneconomic for telecoms providers to develop the service due to the low density of population. A 28 week procurement programme has begun, with 2 companies interested in laying the necessary fibre-optic cables. Implementation will take place between June 2013 and December 2014. Once completed, the greater the take-up by customers, the more money the county will be able to claw back in order to re-invest and roll out the service further. The new faster broadband is not expected to cost customers more than their current service. Residents of Dorset are being urged to register their interest online. Registrations from specific parishes will demonstrate that communities are keen to see faster broadband speeds and thus add weight to the business case for laying cables in our area. This was followed on 9th January by another return visit, this time from Rob Curtis, who gave an illustrated lecture on the fascinating subject of turnpikes, toll houses and the days of the stage coach in Dorset. The next meeting will be held on 13th February, when Phil Gamble will be giving advice on hanging baskets. New members and guests can be assured of a very warm welcome.

Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 10th January 2013. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish website (www.parrettandaxe.org.uk) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were County Councillor Rebecca Knox and District Councillor Janet Page. Matthew Williams, DCC Highways, attended as an invited guest speaker for the first part of the meeting. Apologies were received from Cllr Liz Fray, District Cllr Caroline Payne, PCSO Alex Bishop, Dominie de la Poer and Dave McSkelly.

- Beaminster Tunnel Work has started on the Beaminster Tunnel and it is hoped that it will be reopened by May 2013.
- A356 Variable Message Signs Presented at the Parish Council meeting and featured on the front

A356 – Further Issues

- The hedges of some properties alongside the A356 need to be kept cut to improve visibility on the road. Please will all residents ensure that overhanging foliage does not cause an obstruction thereby endangering the public.
- The kerbstones outside Swing Gate Cottage were loose and broken.
- The cat's eyes on the road past the former golf club, should be reinstated for reasons of safety.
- Pot holes on the Crewkerne side of South Perrott keep opening up despite frequent patching. Cllr Knox advised that the road is scheduled for resurfacing where necessary but cannot be closed for works until the Beaminster Tunnel is reopened as it is part of the official diversion route.
- Drains between Sarum/Winton Cottage and Shepherds Farm, and also outside Hunters Hatch, need regular clearing.
- At the Lecher Lane junction with the A356 water tracks across the road and is a hazard in icy

Matthew Williams suggested that these problems were listed and sent to his manager. It was possible that these might be included when the site visit was made to discuss the installation of the Variable Message Signs.

- ❖ Superfast broadband Cllr Knox reported that progress was being made with Superfast Broadband and hoped that the parish would benefit from the money which was available specifically for rural areas. Jill Turner and Neil Dienhardt are our local Superfast Broadband Champions. Jill Turner reported that she had attended a meeting of Champions held in County Hall. At this meeting it had been explained that superfast broadband would be available to 95% of properties by 2015. − Jill's report is included in this issue. The County Council is encouraging people to register their interest online at www.dorsetforyou.com/superfast or by telephoning 01305 221048. The Parish Council will write to the Superfast Broadband Team to express an interest in an improved service.
- ❖ Mobile Phone Signals In South Perrott and Chedington mobile phone signals from most service providers are poor to non-existent. This could be resolved by the installation of an additional transmitter. Sites have been suggested in South Perrott and it is understood that the host site receives a hosting fee from the service provider. A number of residents would like to pursue this as it is considerably inconvenient these days to be without mobile phone access. Cllr Knox was alerted to the fact that there is no mast serving South Perrott.

❖ Refurbishment of The Pound, South Perrott

Two quotes have been obtained for building a planter and laying paving slabs: one for £903 and one for £640. The quote for £640 was agreed and work will start imminently. The parish council has funds of £300 allocated in its budget and South Perrott Village Hall has promised a donation. It was hoped that the remainder of the cost would be raised by donations. Residents have all received a copy of the sketch of the proposed refurbishment and no negative comments have been received. The repainting of the telephone kiosk is on BT's maintenance schedule. A reminder will be sent to BT to action.

- ❖ Road Clearance at this time of year it is particularly important that farmers, landowners and contractors are aware of their responsibilities to keep the roads clear of hazards, including mud and hedge trimmings, to minimise the risk to other road users.
- ❖ **Pipplepen Lane** The flooding under the bridge had been cleared before Christmas; however at the time of writing it had flooded again and was currently impassable.
- ❖ Precept for 2013-2014 Members approved the Precept of £3,800.
- Planning Applications One application has been handled since the last PC meeting: 1/D/12/001625 & 1/D/12/001626 Rose Cottage, South Perrott erect rear extension (renewal of previous permissions).
- Council Tax for Second Home owners From April 2013 second home owners will be required to pay the full council tax rate.
- ❖ Waitrose, Crewkerne have offered the parish a tree to mark their 75th anniversary of joining the John Lewis Partnership. This was gratefully accepted and a suitable site will be found.
