#### **Chedington and South Perrott Gardening Club**

On 10<sup>th</sup> February Neil Lovesey enlightened his audience about the year of the nurseryman. What a busy one it is, particularly as he propagates all that he sells. As usual he was very free with hints, tips and advice from his vast depth of knowledge. Two very good tips; buy plants out of season (they are much cheaper and can be propagated), and take a photograph of your garden every three months - it will make it clearer what needs attention, changing, filling in, and so on.

On 9<sup>th</sup> March Christine Stone spoke about Harold Peto (1854-1933), whose brother lived in Chedington Court and is buried in St James's Church yard. Harold was very well travelled. Starting his career as an architect, he ventured into landscape gardening, mainly in the Italian style such as that at Buscot House in Oxfordshire (pictured here), with great success. There is no direct proof, but the Court gardens could well have been influenced by him.

We look forward to something very different on 13<sup>th</sup> April when Mike Colbourne's subject is Monkey World. On 11<sup>th</sup> May there is a visit to Brimsmore Garden centre.



# Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2016. A full set of the agreed minutes from this meeting will be available on the Parish website (<u>www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</u>) or from the Clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were County Cllr. Rebecca Knox, PCSO Alex Bishop and River/Flood Warden, Martyn Gillingham. Apologies were received from: District Cllrs Tony Alford and Peter Barrowcliff, Dominie de la Poer (footpaths officer) and Dave McSkelly. Jez Morris, Magna Housing attended to give a presentation on the organisation.

Magna Housing Association - Jez Morris, Head of Housing Services, advised that he was visiting local councils in order to raise awareness of the Association. There are 16 Magna properties in South Perrott and he explained how the new Right to Buy scheme has been extended to housing association tenants. Magna is willing to put money into community schemes, with a ceiling of £1,000 for any individual project, if their residents will benefit from them.

Jill Brighouse, Magna Housing Officer, met Cllr. Kate Organ to discuss issues with the Magna housing in School Hill. Jill is arranging for bulkhead lighting to be installed as a response to concerns expressed by residents to improve the safety of access to their front doors.

#### \* Reports from County Councillor and Police Officer

> Clir. Rebecca Knox reported on the following: -

**Rural Bus Services Review** - following a very useful meeting in Mosterton of interested parties, Cllr. Knox reported that villages were putting forward their own ideas for alternative rural transport and asked the parish council to put forward solutions that would suit Chedington and South Perrott residents. Cllrs. Kate Organ and Liz Fray attended this meeting. It was agreed that they would meet with bus users in South Perrott and Chedington to discuss options. (*This meeting will be on 31<sup>st</sup> March at 17:00 in SP Village Hall.*)

**Local Government in Dorset -** Cllr. Knox reported that DCC were looking at the future shape of local government – whether Dorset should become a Shire (unitary authority), with more power devolved to its towns and parishes.

- PCSO Alex Bishop advised that his team was still stationed in the Police Station at Beaminster but at some point would be moving to accommodation in the Fire Station. If anyone notices anything suspicious, please report this to the Police on 101.
- \* Highways issues -
- Potholes DCC has issued its provisional Capital Programme Schedule for 2016/17. Lecher Lane and School Hill in South Perrott, and Chedington Village Road are all scheduled for "surface dressing". Highways have been asked to spot-patch the worst potholes in the interim.

Residents have expressed concerns at the number of potholes and the disintegration of the road surface in **Picket Lane**. The matter has been reported to DCC Highways for action.

- 20 mph Speed Limit County Cllr Rebecca Knox provided detailed information about the 20mph speed limit which has been installed in Broadwindsor. A similar scheme in South Perrott could cost the Parish Council in the region of £6,500, which members considered to be prohibitive. There was also doubt as to whether it would achieve the desired reduction in speed. It was agreed not to pursue this any further.
- Slurry, Straw and Mud residents and councillors complained of straw, slurry and mud along the A356 and in Picket and Pipplepen Lanes. (The situation is unacceptable and the Chairman is in contact with the farmers.)
- Railings in Picket Lane, South Perrott DCC Highways have continued to state that they are not responsible for the maintenance of these railings. It was agreed that the Clerk should continue to pursue Highways, at a higher level, and in addition, obtain further quotes to ascertain the cost of the repairs.
- Superfast Broadband Fibre Broadband should be available imminently in both Chedington and South Perrott. Residents are reminded that they will need to contact their ISP to receive the new service as they will not be connected automatically and there is likely to be a charge.

A concern was raised that the fibre cable is strung along the telegraph poles from Winyards Gap down into South Perrott and could be damaged in high winds. There is thought to be an underground duct in the road put in by Mercury Communications some time ago. The clerk will pursue with Open Reach. (*Subsequent to the meeting, the Green cabinets in South Perrott and Chedington are now live.*)

Mobile Phone Coverage - Dr David Lines reported on a meeting on 30 January 2016, with Oliver Letwin MP, when Mr Letwin explained that the emergency services are in the process of updating their Airwave network. EE have won the contract to provide the new Emergency Services Mobile Communications Programme (ESMCP). A second survey of the signal strength outside properties was conducted in South Perrott which ascertained that, at best, only a very weak or intermittent signal was available. Mr Letwin has subsequently reported that, as part of the upgrade required for a 4G service and for the ESMCP, there will be an upgrade of service coverage in South Perrott. Mobile coverage in

the village will be independently tested and verified once the 4G and ESMCP systems are in place. There should be a properly working EE 4G signal in South Perrott by the end of 2017.

- Her Majesty the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday Dorset communities are being encouraged to commemorate the Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday by holding a celebratory event on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2016. It was agreed that a Tower Mint commemorative medal would be given to each child in both villages. It was suggested that a tea party could be held in South Perrott. The Village Hall Committee is to be approached about organising this and Peter Hinton offered the use of his field, weather permitting.
- \* Annual Village Meetings Chedington's will be held on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> April and South Perrott's on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2016. Both will be held in their village halls and will start at 7pm.

WD/D/15/002365 - Bellamy Farm, South Perrott - Demolish coach house and erect building for use as ancillary residential accommodation (amended description).

WD/D/16/000100 (Listed Building Consent), Bridge Farmhouse, South Perrott - rebuild garden wall and steps, replacing paving in courtyard and constructing timber pergola on brick piers.

#### > Decisions Notified by WDDC since last meeting:

WD/D/15/001751 Broadleaze Farm, Chedington – erect bird hide and store (retrospective). Approval of Planning Permission.

WD/D/15/002767 - Riverside, South Perrott - insertion of roof light on rear roof slope. Approval of Listed **Building Consent** 

#### > New Applications to be considered:

WD/D/16/000294 Buckham Mill Farm, Mosterton (adjoining parish) - Conversion of disused farm building into four holiday units and installation of four conservation roof lights. Members raised no concerns about this application.

WD/D/15/002692 Coach and Horses Inn, South Perrott – Single and two-storey extensions to existing Inn to include formation of: a garage, cold store and cellar, and balcony with access staircases. Members and residents expressed their wish to see the pub continue to trade in the village but raised a number of concerns, particularly with regard to the balcony and access stairs of the extensions which overlooked the homes and gardens of near neighbours.
