Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 11th July 2013. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish website (<u>www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</u>) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were County Cllr. Rebecca Knox and District Cllrs. Janet Page and Caroline Payne. Apologies were received from PCSO Alex Bishop

Beaminster Tunnel: This is scheduled to reopen at 10:00 on Monday 29th July 2013 when Dorset County Council will open the road to two-way traffic. Temporary traffic signals may be used to allow the contractors to complete the work and ensure the safety of road users. However these signals will be used only at non-peak times and not during weekends.

✤ A356 Road Issues:

- **Kerbstones and Crossings** Now that the Tunnel has reopened the kerbstones along the A356 from Swing Gate Cottage to Picket Lane will be replaced with an alternative material. If this proves to be successful this will be extended to other sections of the footway where the edging is fracturing. This work will be carried out in October 2013 to coincide with the resurfacing of parts of the A356 as the work will necessitate temporary road closures. DCC Highways have also agreed to feather the edges of the crossing at the Bakers Arms.
- **Resurfacing** The section of the A356 past the former golf course is scheduled to be closed in October 2013 for resurfacing and also to replace the cats' eyes. The section of the A356 from South Perrott to the county border has not yet been included in this schedule as DCC Highways consider it to be in a reasonable condition.
- **Speed** Following concerns by local residents that vehicles approach South Perrott at excessive speed a number of speed checks have been carried out in the past few months. These monitored traffic approaching South Perrott from the Dorchester direction. The results have shown that very few vehicles are travelling above the speed limit; however there is still a perception by local residents that there is an issue with speed. As budgets are very tight DCC Highways will not spend money on traffic calming measures unless there has been a history of serious collisions.

Refurbishment of The Pound, South Perrott - Quotes from local contractors are being sought as the ones received to date exceed the available budget.

Following a suggestion made at the last meeting the Chairman of DIGS (Dorset Important Geological Sites), had inspected the rock face in The Pound. He identified the rock as Oolitic Limestone from the Middle Jurassic Period and said that it is not of any great geological significance. However, interestingly it is believed that the Coach & Horses may have been constructed from this stone possibly extracted from the rock face in The Pound.

South Perrott Village & Parish Planning Meeting – A working group meeting has been arranged for Thursday 29th August at 18:30 in South Perrott Village Hall Annex. The purpose of this Group is to draft a development plan for the parish of South Perrott to cover both the short and long term i.e. next 20 years.

The initial meeting will be to agree a strategy for producing the plan. This meeting will consider the remit and develop a questionnaire designed to give every resident the opportunity to express their views. Subsequent meetings will include data collection and analysis. There will be further public consultation on the draft plans prior to publication.

- Thefts from Vehicles warning. Thefts from unattended motor vehicles are common at this time of the year. The police are reminding everyone who parks in isolated areas never to leave belongings in their vehicle even if they are hidden away.
- Superfast Broadband the Broadband contract has now been signed by the local authority and 97% of the county should receive improved broadband coverage by 2016.
- Empty properties Since April 2013 properties which have been empty for two years or more will have a Council Tax levy of 150%.
- County Councillor Rebecca Knox is now a member of the DCC Cabinet with a portfolio for Safeguarding Children & Families. Rebecca remains Chairman of the Fire Authority.
