Breakfast Consultation - Let's Answer It!

Forty residents attended the feedback meeting (Let's Answer It!), on 5th October following the Parish breakfast consultation held in June. The key themes arising were:

Transport – availability and frequency of bus services to give access to shops, education and employment. **The Road** – speeding, appearance and pinch point in South Perrott and surfaces in Chedington.

Communications - telephones (landline & mobile), broadband, website & social media.

Village Services and Amenities – Community Shop, Public Houses, Library, Village Halls, green spaces and footpaths, and new homes.

There were some suggestions made which the community can action. Many residents would like more informal breakfast events. The bell ringers have recently held a breakfast in South Perrott Village Hall to raise funds for the Bell Tower. Perhaps other groups could organise similar events either to raise funds or just to cover the cost of hosting.

The Parish Council will continue to lobby and work in conjunction with bodies such as the district and county councils on many of the issues raised. Some are ongoing and are reported under the Parish Council section of this Pump and Pound. Some can be dealt with immediately whilst others require a longer term solution.

Most importantly we need to keep the dialogue open with all residents so that everyone can agree with the sentiment expressed by one of our residents "I love our village. How lucky we are to be here!"

Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 13th November 2014. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish website (<u>www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</u>) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were County Councillor, Rebecca Knox and District Cllr. Caroline Payne. Apologies were received from Dist. Cllr. Janet Page and Dominie de la Poer.

REPORTS FROM THE COUNCILS:

Dorset County Council:

Bakers Arms Crossing on A356 – Cllr Knox met the owners of the Bakers Arms to discuss the crossing outside their property. It will cost \pounds 3,500 to remove this crossing and if placed onto the Highways work schedule it could take years to action. Alternatively it might be possible sooner if private funds were raised.

A356 – Speeding see below.

Gully clearing – DCC has been granted Government funding to enable a programme of gully clearing along all the roads in Dorset. Cllr Knox encouraged people to report any blocked drains online, so that they are placed on the list for regular maintenance.

West Dorset District Council:

The new recycling scheme for West Dorset will come into effect w/c 13 July 2015. Further information will be issued, by Dorset Waste Partnership, to all affected households. West Dorset and Weymouth & Portland councils have voted in principle to join with North Dorset District Council. By March 2015 all three councils will be served by one Chief Executive Officer.

Highways Issues

A356 – Speed of traffic through South Perrott – two new residents of South Perrott have raised concerns about the speed of traffic coming down the hill from the Chedington direction. They suggested that either a 20mph speed limit or a priority system be implemented. The Chairman explained that the Parish Council has been actively working on this issue for many years. To date no practical solution has been found although the 20mph speed limit is currently being explored.

Broadwindsor is introducing a 20mph speed limit and the progress of that scheme will be monitored. Cllr Knox is buying a speed indicator device (SID) for her division to use in the villages in her area which will include South Perrott. Meanwhile Speedwatch will be followed up with PCSO Alex Bishop.

- A356 White Lines and Cats Eyes concern was raised that the white lines and cats eyes have still not been reinstated on the A356 towards Chedington.
- Junction A3066/Lecher Lane A site meeting had been held with DCC Highways to consider possible improvements to lessen the danger from overtaking traffic at this junction. A formal request has now been made to DCC Highways for a Traffic Regulation Order for a dedicated right turn lane on the A3066 to protect vehicles turning right into Lecher Lane.
- Breakfast Consultation Feedback Let's Answer It! See item on the front page. Dave McSkelly and Jo Morgan were thanked for their excellent feedback presentation held on Sunday 5th October.
- BT proposal to remove Phone Box in the Pound BT have begun a consultation on its proposal to remove public payphones from phone boxes that have had little usage. South Perrott's phone box is on BT's list because only six calls have been made from it in the last 12 months. Members considered that the biggest justification for retaining this phone box was for emergency use as there is no mobile phone signal in the village. The clerk is to respond to the consultation.
- Superfast Broadband Chedington and South Perrott are still on schedule to receive this in 2015 although the exact date is still not known.

✤ Approval of Budget and Precept for 2015-2016

Members approved the proposed Budget for 2015-2016 and were minded to approve a Precept of £3,800. This decision will be ratified in January 2015.

Six cannabis plants had been found growing in a field near the Millennium Green. These have been removed by the Police.
