Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the meeting of the Parish Council held on Thursday 14th January 2016. A full set of the agreed minutes from this meeting will be available on the Parish website (<u>www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</u>) or from the Clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were District Cllrs Tony Alford and Peter Barrowcliff and River/Flood Warden, Martyn Gillingham. Apologies were received from: Cllr Kate Organ, County Cllr Rebecca Knox, PCSO Alex Bishop and Dominie de la Poer (footpaths officer).

* Reports From County And District Councillors And Police Officers

- District Cllr Tony Alford advised that currently it is more cost effective for mixed material for recycling to be collected and taken to North Wales for sorting by technology into the different types than doing this locally. He also reported that no Syrian refugee settlements were planned for the immediate area although 20 families may be settled in Bournemouth.
- In a written report, PCSO Alex Bishop advised that following reports of fly-tipping, that the local authority will only deal with offences, and the collection/disposal of the rubbish, if it is on public land. On private land, it is the responsibility of the landowner. Cllr. Sue Coutanche reported that again there was extensive fly-tipping, including household items, in Lecher Lane, which she and that Mosterton Parish Clerk have reported. These have now been removed. Cllr. Jane Cooper said that the fly-tipping in Chedington Lane had been removed quickly. If anyone is seen fly-tipping please report this to the Police on 101.

Highways issues

- Dip in A356 west of South Perrott the flooding has been reported. Martyn Gillingham and Jane Cooper were thanked for attempting to unblock the gullies.
- Land drain behind village hall, South Perrott Blair Turner, Highways, has inspected this drain and reported that the highways drainage system is not designed to cope with the volume of water flowing from the ditch in times of high rain fall, and it would be necessary to install a minor head wall and spillway to direct the flow of water into the gully.
- > Chedington The road surface in Chedington Lane is continuing to deteriorate.
- Crossing outside Bakers Arms There was due to be a road closure on 18/19th January to enable this crossing point to be removed. This work was carried out and completed on 19th January 2016. Lisa & Jeremy Thackwell are pleased to report that as a result there has been an immediate improvement in the noise level.
- Railings in Picket Lane, South Perrott DCC Highways have confirmed that whilst highway rights extend over Picket Lane and the grass bank they are not responsible for the maintenance of the railings. Enquiries at the Land Registry have revealed that the grass bank is in unknown ownership and it is also beyond the riparian ownership of the adjoining properties. Cllr Coutanche referred to a meeting with Highways in 2006 about riparian ownership [but a subsequent look at the minutes of this meeting has not revealed ownership of the railings]. Their repair is continuing to be pursued with the County and Rebecca Knox has also been made aware of the issue.
- Superfast Broadband South Perrott's green cabinet is waiting for connection to the electricity supply after which it should become operational. An electricity supply has already been provided for the Chedington green cabinet although an operational date has not been notified.
- Mobile Phone Coverage The report by Dr David Lines has been sent to Ofcom but, despite chasing by the Parish Council, no response to date has been received. Oliver Letwin, MP is scheduled to meet the Parish Council and Dr Lines on 30th January 2016 to discuss this issue. The outcome of this meeting will be reported in the next issue of the Pump & Pound.
- Rural Bus Services Review DCC are conducting a review of rural bus services which is open for consultation until 8th February and is on <u>www.dorsetforyou.com</u>. Disappointment was expressed at the

proposed cutting of the weekly 213 bus service to Dorchester, which is viewed as a valuable social as well as transport amenity. It was agreed that the Clerk would respond to the consultation, on similar lines to the response used in 2013 when the 204 weekly service to Yeovil was under threat and has been retained.

- Dog Waste in Chedington The Parish Council are in communication with Dorset Waste Partnership about suitable bins for the disposal of dog waste. Residents in both villages are reminded to dispose of their dog's waste considerately. It is a health hazard!
- Neighbourhood Plans Following a meeting on 24th November 2015 it was decided that it was not necessary for South Perrott and Chedington to produce a Neighbourhood Plan as they had no defined development boundaries.
- River Warden's Report Flood Warning Signs Agreement Martyn Gillingham reported that the flood warning signs have now been delivered and he had been instructed on their use. DCC requires Flood volunteers to be formally appointed by the Parish Council and covered under the PC's insurance policy. Martyn Gillingham and Donald Hargreaves were duly authorised to undertake this work.

Planning Applications

> Applications handled since last meeting:

WD/D/15/001751 Broadleaze Farm, Chedington – erect bird hide and store (retrospective). PC comments – no concerns.

WD/D/15/002365 - Bellamy Farm, South Perrott – the conversion of the Coach House and its single storey garage into a granny annexe (retrospective). If approval is granted, PC request that limitations are attached to the "Granny annexe" to prevent the building being sold off separately from the farmhouse.

WD/D/15/002767 - Riverside, South Perrott – insertion of roof light on rear roof slope. PC comments – no objection in principle.

New Applications to be considered

WD/D/15/002440 (Listed Building Consent) Maple Cottage, South Perrott – return of double garage to living accommodation, infill of garage door (retrospective). Main concerns were the current parking arrangements now that the conversion has been made, which compromises access to the neighbouring property and the farmer's field.

- Other Planning Issues Coach & Horses Inn – a retrospective planning application has been received by the Planning Department but further information has been requested.
- Cornerways Cottage this application has stalled.
