Four Stars for the Coach and Horses Inn

There has been a hostelry on the site of the Coach and Horses since 1744 although recent investigation has shown that there has been a building here since 1673 (which is consistent with the date stone above

the door on the A356). During its life there have been many changes. The latest alterations are the installation of a new kitchen and the conversion of the old kitchen into a retaurant. Much of the hard work was carried out by the owner, John Harris, and the landlord, Gary Lancaster, but using local tradesmen when appropriate, with very little disruption to the day to day running of the inn. At the same time, Gary took the opportunity to introduce a new menu and to install a Sunday carvery. The new dining facilities where formally opened on September 30th 2011. On 3rd October, West Dorset Environmental Health Officers inspected the inn and awarded the Coach and Horses a 4 star rating. In fact, it is impossible for Gary to achieve a higher rating without employing full time kitchen staff so congratulations are definitely in order! But there is more to the dining room than meets the eye. At the



drop of a trapdoor, it converts into a skittles alley which is just as well with eight teams based here. It also provides a venue for village hall activities when the hall is unavailable, as well as regularly hosting a number of local clubs. In short the pub is the hub of the village in all respects!

New Kitchen for South Perrott Village Hall

As part of the on-going upgrade to South Perrott Village Hall, a new kitchen is being installed from 13th December. Therefore, the hall will not be available from Tuesday 13th December until Monday 9th January. This year's children's party is on Saturday 24th December in Chedington Village Hall at 2pm (for 2.15pm start). Santa will visit from 3pm followed by a party tea. The Harvest Lunch at South Perrott on 9th October 2011 was well attended and the auction of the produce raised £107 for the Weldmar Hospice.

The autumn bazaar on 12th November was another success. The total raised was £346 which was 40% higher than last year. The proceeds go towards church funds.

Jubilee Celebrations

South Perrott Village Hall Committee plans to fund a party for the whole village, young and old alike, to celebrate Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee. This will take place on Sunday 3rd June 2012 and Peter Hinton has kindly allowed the use of the paddock (weather permitting). Vicky Reed circulated a questionnaire at the end of September but to date only a few replies have been received. Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 10th November 2011. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish web site (www.parrettandaxe.org.uk) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors, PCSO Alex Bishop was also in attendance.

* A356 Road Scheme

Road narrow signs have now been erected in the village. The Safety Audit in South Perrott has been conducted, however the report has not yet been signed off or published. See update below.

* A3066

A request had been made to DCC Highways for additional road markings on the stretch of road between Mosterton and Misterton Cross to deter overtaking at the junction with Lecher Lane. DCC Highways advised that a solid white line would not be an appropriate road marking but they would consider a road sign indicating the approaching right turn and/or a SLOW marking. The Parish Council will pursue.

School and Public Bus Service

- DCC advised that they were now having regular meetings with the contractor and that services should be returning to normal after the disruption at the start of the autumn term. Please report any incidents to the Parish Council or Rebecca Knox for referral to DCC.
- It has been reported that the school bus is causing traffic congestion at its pick-up/drop-off point on the main road at the end of Picket Lane. The Parish Council is writing to Damory Coaches to ask if the bus could pick up in Picket Lane by Manor Close.

Street Lighting in South Perrott

New street lights are to be installed in Manor Close. DCC advised that shields will not be installed during installation of these lights. If any resident subsequently experiences light intrusion, shields will be considered.

Hand Gritting Machines

As requested at the previous meeting two Hand Gritting Machines for grit spreading during icy weather will be purchased at a cost of approximately £100 each for use by the two villages.

Introduction to Community Planning

At a recent WDDC meeting Parish Councils were advised to draw up a Community Plan to avoid the risk of having a plan imposed. It was agreed to defer action until July 2012 as new legislation may be introduced which could have implications for future planning.

Planning

Six decisions have been notified by WDDC since the last Parish Council meeting. There has been one new application from Pickett Farm, South Perrott to construct an above ground concrete panel animal slurry compound. This is an EU requirement. The Parish Council had no objection.

South Perrott Village Hall

A request was considered from South Perrott Village Hall Committee for a contribution of 5% (£286.46) towards the cost of a new kitchen. This was agreed and would be paid from the 2011/12 Parish Precept.

Budget and Precept for 2012-2013

Members discussed the proposed budget for 2012/13 and agreed not to increase the Precept, which will remain at £3,600.

Police Report

- A series of sheep thefts have recently occurred in the area and residents are asked to alert the police if they see anything suspicious such as unknown vans parked by field gates.
- Residents are reminded that it is now the time of year when most oil thefts take place. The "Stop That Oil" scheme appears to be working as there has been a reduction in the number of reported thefts

A356 Update from DCC Highways

Headlines from the recent Safety Audit – the full report will be available in the New Year and Andrew Bradley, DCC Highways Management Engineer, will be discussing this at the Parish Council meeting on 12th January 2012.

- Shared use of the footway in the environs of Lecher Lane Issues: poor visibility between opposing traffic (particularly HGV's) causing conflict where the road narrows; the speed of traffic particularly the downhill approach; use of coloured surfacing across the road does not help to differentiate the shared space; the up stand (kerb) could be a hazard to cyclists/motorcyclists.
- Narrow stretch at Swing Gate Cottage Issues; speed of traffic and insufficient road width causing conflict.

The Dorset Country Cars Scheme.

This scheme provides transport for anyone in the parish who needs it. The drivers are volunteers and will take a person anywhere they want to go, for example, on a shopping trip, to visit someone in hospital or doctor, dentist & other appointments. The maximum distance is a 50-mile round trip. There is a cost of 30p a mile to the passenger, and the drivers are reimbursed their petrol money from funds provided by DCC.
