Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 8th September 2011. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish web site (<u>www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</u>) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors, County Councillor Rebecca Knox, District Councillors Janet Page and Caroline Payne, and PCSO Paul Miners were also in attendance.

School Transport. New contracts have been awarded for school and public bus services and this has resulted in some of the services not keeping to time or to the correct route. There have been many complaints from parents and some children have been left stranded at pick up points. This is a county wide problem. The Parish Council will write to the bus companies.

Latest News!: Action has been taken by DCC to provide extra buses and Toni Coombs, Cabinet member for Children's Services, has pledged that she will personally monitor the contract between DCC and Damory Coaches who operate the service. Clir Rebecca Knox is compiling a dossier of all incidents and she should be notified of any problems. (*Contact details below*).

- Cllr Knox reported that the pot holes in Chedington were scheduled to be repaired in October 2011.
- Copies of the Beaminster Area Local Business Directory, which advertise local amenities, businesses and services, are available from the Parish Clerk.
- Street Lighting in Dorset Cllrs Organ and Legg had attended a street lighting consultation in Mosterton on 15th August. At the meeting residents from Broadwindsor had voiced their concerns about their new street lighting which was very white and bright. Cllr Organ has spoken to residents in Manor Close where the street lamps are due to be replaced. Most of the residents want lighting but are concerned about the brightness of the new lights. It was agreed that the Parish Council will request that deflecting shields are attached to the lamps when they are installed.

* A356 Road Scheme – Update

- A site meeting was held on 17th August between two Parish Cllrs and Cllr Knox and Andrew Bradley from DCC Highways to discuss the on-going concerns about road safety at Hill Farm bend and the Swing Gate Cottage pinch point. Incidents have been frequently reported. Recently there have been four residents that have had serious damage to their tyres and two drivers have written to DCC highways with photographic evidence as well as informing the Parish Council. There have also been a number of other incidents. It was suggested that road signs indicating priority for drivers might help traffic flow through this narrow section of road.
- **Safety Audit** Andrew Bradley has confirmed that a safety audit is due to take place at the end of September. He was reminded that we are still waiting "road narrows" signage at each end of the village. In addition Andrew Bradley is to request a full Police speed check in the village and it was agreed that the Parish Council would also write to Dorset Road Safe to support this request.
- Size and Weight of HGVs A letter has been sent to DCC following a response from the FTA suggesting that the Parish Council obtain support from DCC Highways for a size and weight restriction to be imposed.
- **Chedington Notice Board** Mr Charles is to be asked to make the new notice board and also to repair the wooden bench in The Pound in South Perrott.
- **Hand gritters** for both villages are to be priced with a view to purchase.
- A3066/Lecher Lane The dangerous stretch of road on the A3066 at the junction with Lecher Lane has been raised with Mosterton Parish Council. A letter will be sent to DCC Highways requesting that a solid white line is painted on the road from Chapel Court Farm to beyond the Lecher Lane turning to prohibit overtaking on this downhill stretch.
- Bob Buckland (Tree Warden) reported that the horse chestnut trees in the village were in danger of dying from disease. An ash tree opposite Manor Close and an alder at the junction of A356 and Picket Lane are overhanging the river and the Environment Agency is to be asked to inspect these trees.
