### Parrett & Axe Parish Council

Below is a summary of some of the topics discussed at the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> September 2014. A full set of the agreed minutes will be available on the Parish website (<u>www.parrettandaxe.org.uk</u>) or from the clerk when accepted at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors and Clerk, also in attendance were District Cllrs. Janet Page and Caroline Payne. Apologies were received from PCSO Alex Bishop, County Councillor, Rebecca Knox, Footpaths Officer, Dominie de la Poer and Jo Morgan.

#### ✤ HIGHWAYS ISSUES

- A356 Speed of traffic Residents are still concerned about the speed of traffic as it approaches the village downhill from Chedington. A suggestion of imposing a 20mph limit is unenforceable and therefore not viable. Subsequent to the meeting Dorset Police will be contacted to request a Speed watch.
- Junction A3066/Lecher Lane it has been suggested that a sign is erected at the end of Lecher Lane to warn drivers of overtaking vehicles on the A3066. It was suggested that a register should be kept of all near-misses. The clerk to request a joint site meeting with Mosterton PC and Highways.
- Crossing outside Bakers Arms the noise level from traffic driving over the crossing had increased since the remedial works were completed. Agricultural vehicles and trailers in particular were noisy, often late at night. County Cllr Rebecca Knox has now met with Mr and Mrs Thackwell, the owners of Bakers Arms, to discuss the issue.
- White lines on A356 A request has been made to reinstate the white lines on the sides of the road coming into South Perrott from the Chedington direction within the 30mph limit. The clerk will write to Highways again.
- The road from Winyards Gap to Halstock is to be closed for resurfacing in November. Petty Box Lane will be resurfaced at the same time.
- Chedington Lane It was reported that the road surface towards Mosterton was deteriorating. The Clerk will liaise with Mosterton Parish Council.
- Maintenance of Footpaths: DCC is inviting all parish councils to sign up to a Service Level Agreement (SLA) to share the cost of maintaining the footpaths and bridleways in their areas. A meeting has taken place with the Rights of Way team and overgrown footpaths in South Perrott have been identified. Under an SLA the cost to the parish council would be 20p per linear metre. Alternatively a local volunteer group could be set up and DCC would provide training and the loan of equipment for the group to undertake the maintenance. It was decided not to make a commitment at this stage.

Roger Legg advised that he had put forward a proposal to DCC that, if sufficient road planings are available, he would be willing to dedicate a strip of land across his fields to make a new bridleway joining Picket Lane with Langmoor Lane. This would allow Mr Legg to drive his farm machinery between his fields and would also benefit the community by creating a circular walk around the village.

It was reported that the field gate on the footpath opposite Old School House, Pipplepen Lane, is often locked.

- Flood/River Warden Martyn Gillingham advised that the Environment Agency is recruiting Flood Wardens and that he was willing to undertake training for this role. His offer was accepted.
- Community Sandbag Stores WDDC is offering to provide sandbags for use during flooding, if suitable storage is available. It was agreed that Martyn Gillingham would follow this up.

- Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October Breakfast Consultation Feedback. This will be held in South Perrott Village Hall. See details on the front page.
- REPORTS FROM THE COUNCILS the theme from both the County and District Councils is cost savings:-

**Dorset County Council** by greater integration within departments. A key part of their strategy is to become 'digital by default' and to encourage flexible working. The benefits of the upgraded technology should be less travel, more on-site reporting of highways problems, and swifter engagement in social services with those they are helping.

**West Dorset District Council** (who already deliver a number of services and share 'back office' functions with Weymouth & Portland Borough Council), by adopting a similar arrangement with North Dorset district Council. Discussions are currently being held.

- Review of Parish Council Representation The Chedington Councillors are still in discussion about the future representation on the Parish Council. There is nothing further to report at this stage.
- Picket Lane Fencing Highways have been informed of damage and deterioration to the fencing alongside the river in Picket Lane. Highways have now inspected and taped. The repairs are imminent
- Grit Spreaders They also make ideal fertilizer spreaders! These will now be sold on eBay as there was no local interest in purchasing.
