Once again it was a complete success raising £3461 for St Mary's Church!

PARRETT & AXE PARISH COUNCIL

Below is a summary of the points of interest arising from the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 14th July. The full minutes will be available on the Parish web site (www.parrettandaxe.org.uk) or from the clerk once agreed at the next meeting. In addition to the Parish Councillors, our two District Councillors, Janet Page and Caroline Payne, were also in attendance.

- ❖ County Councillor Knox in a written report said she had requested a 'no right turn' into Lecher Lane from South Perrott and reported the potholes in Chedington to the appropriate authority. Cllrs Legg and Organ would attend a street lighting consultation on 15th August.
- PCSO Alex Bishop reported in writing that the following thefts had occurred a vehicle from Chedington, a copper tank from Mosterton and hosepipe. He reminded attendees of the "Stop That Oil" scheme aimed at preventing thefts from oil tanks.

❖ Parish/Town Development Survey

16 responses were received for South Perrott and 13 from Chedington. South Perrott residents indicated that they would like between 1 and 3 new units of employment, community facilities, affordable housing, farm diversification and tourism accommodation over the next ten years. Chedington residents indicated overwhelmingly that they wanted no changes to their village. A concern was raised that the responses received may not have been a representative sample of the residents.

Chedington Notice Board

The notice board was in need of replacement.

The public session - It was proposed that the timing should be altered. It was agreed that this would be deferred to a future meeting.

❖ Telephone Box in South Perrott

Cllr Johnson advised that in addition to emergency calls, a credit card call could be made from the box by dialling a certain number. It was agreed not to progress the Adopt a Kiosk scheme.

❖ A356 Road Scheme

Members considered the following issues: -

- Traffic noise outside Bakers Arms was causing a nuisance. It was agreed that a letter would be sent to DCC Highways.
- Safety Audit Members expressed their concerns that the village was less safe than before the road works due to the lack of signage and the need to educate drivers. A final safety audit had still to be implemented.
- Peter Larkman advised that it might be possible to seek a voluntary or advisory routing agreement from the Freight Transport Association (FTA). It was agreed that the Parish Council contact the FTA regarding a routing agreement.
- Speed Restriction residents at Sockety have requested that the 30mph speed limit should be extended to the old golf course. It was agreed that a letter would be sent to DCC Highways requesting this. It was also agreed to ask PC Tim Poole if a Speedwatch exercise could be conducted to monitor traffic entering and leaving the village.
- The Pound The greenery needs to be cut back from the high wall and the bench needs to be repaired or replaced and moved. In addition, the clerk is writing to WDDC requesting that the litter bin is also moved.

The following points were raised in the Public Session: -

- The Parish Council was thanked for funding the circular regarding Himalayan Balsam. It was reported that the numbers attending the two working parties had been disappointingly low.
- A written request was submitted for the parish council website to be regularly updated. The Clerk will follow this up.
- A written comment was submitted regarding the narrow stretch of road past Swing Gate Cottage and the damage caused to a vehicle by the new high kerb.
- An email was read out regarding the lateness of the postal delivery in South Perrott.

Latest Update on A356

Michael Johnson and Kate Organ (with Angela Gillingham taking notes) had a walkabout meeting on the A356 in August with our County Councillor, Rebecca Knox, and Andrew Bradley of DCC Highways. This proved most informative and provided the Parish Council with an opportunity to raise a number of issues that we would like the County Council to address. Possible solutions were discussed but these will have to wait for the safety audit to be finished and the cost of any works to be taken into consideration.

DCC Highways should be commended for their prompt reaction in carrying out works to the crossing point between the Bakers Arms and Church Hill to relieve the traffic noise problems being experienced by residents thereabouts, this being an item at our July meeting.
