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


You let go first. No, you let go. No, you. No, you.

Now Nicholas hoped the seminar guests would just leave.




Eric had a good feeling before signing the deal, then out of nowhere came a deep regret.


#### SEPTEMBER




The megaphone prank wasn't funny back when Ron was new in Maintenance 19 years ago, and it still wasn't funny today.





Already when he presented himself as "Moses" during the interview, the managers should have realized he wasn't suitable for working in infrastructure.




Tracy was glad «Handsome Henry» had come to help. Stanley, however, realized his chances of a date were now ruined.

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
