TERMINOLOGY

Arguably, there is confusion within the celebrant industry with regards to terminology used when referring to celebrants. To alleviate this confusion we have simplified the terms that follow in order that anyone reading this is clear of our interpretation.

A family celebrant is a celebrant that can design, write and deliver wedding ceremonies / civil partnership ceremonies, Renewal of Vows ceremonies, naming ceremonies and any other life event ceremonies that are conventionally accepted as being joyous and happy in nature. People referred to as a wedding celebrant can also be known as a family celebrant.

RELIGION?

The United Kingdom Society of Celebrants caters predominantly for secular celebrants, that is to say that religion is of little significance in our training and practice. That said, we have trained many celebrants who come from a wide range of faith backgrounds that have gone on to develop niches in specific ethnic / cultural groups.

A **funeral celebrant** is a celebrant that can design, write and officiate over a funeral ceremonies, memorials, commemorations or other life event ceremonies that are conventionally accepted as dealing with a death or loss.

A civil celebrant is a celebrant who can practice as both a family and funeral celebrant. All the above definitions may also be prefixed with one or more of the following as is your want: independent, secular, humanist, non-denominational, spiritual or atheist to name but a few.





TYPES OF TRAINING

Here at the UK Society of Celebrants we have three celebrant training methods for you to choose from.

Our **Distance Learning** courses are our most popular courses.

These courses allow the student to set their own timetable; are the most cost effective and are also the most thorough and enjoyable according to student feedback.



Our **Fast Track** Distance Learning courses can be held at a time of the students choosing in the comfort of their own home. Once again these courses are very intensive, necessitating at least 12+ hours work per day.

Our **Group Training** Residential courses are held monthly and usually start on a Monday at our Sheffield Head Office. Once again these courses are very intensive, necessitating at least 12+ hours work per day.

COURSE FEES DISTANCE LEARNING

Our **Distance** *I* **Guided Learning** courses can be taken at a time and place to suit you.

The courses are computer based with live on-line / telephone mentoring and support as required, with up to 40 hours (subject to course choice) 1:1 with your tutor.

The courses can range from 4-16 weeks in duration.

Certificate in Family Celebrancy (4 to 8 weeks) £1085 or £376 per month (3 months)

Certificate in Funeral Celebrancy (8 to 10 weeks) £1085 or £376 per month (3 months)

Diploma in Family & Funeral Celebrancy (12 to 16 weeks) £1935 or £495 per month (4 months)

You will have on-line access to all learning materials and resources prior to starting your course.

Our delegates have found this course to be the most cost effective and flexible training option.

In order to complete our **Distance Learning** celebrant courses you **must** be computer literate with regard to the most common applications (MS Office, Adobe, Zoom / Skype, web browsers, email, social media facilities etc) have a computer with a live internet connection with a web camera and microphone.

COURSE FEES FAST TRACK DISTANCE LEARNING

All **Fast Track** courses are conducted online via Zoom or Skype and are hosted and delivered by your nominated tutor.

Each day will consist of a full working day on-line with your tutor followed by 4-6 hours homework, except on your final day.

The 3 day course will comprehensively cover ALL aspects of family celebrancy. £1285

Certificate in Funeral Celebrancy

The 3 day course will comprehensively cover ALL aspects of funeral celebrancy. £1285

Diploma in Family & Funeral Celebrancy

COURSE FEES GROUP TRAINING RESIDENTIAL

All **Group Training** courses are conducted in person and are hosted and delivered by your nominated tutor at our Head Office in Sheffield. Groups have no more than 3 candidates.

Each day will consist of a full working day in the classroom, with up to two other candidates and your tutor followed by 4-6 hours homework (except final day).

The 3 day course will comprehensively cover ALL aspects of family celebrancy. £1385

Certificate in Funeral Celebrancy

The 3 day course will comprehensively cover ALL aspects of funeral celebrancy. £1385
