BUS' June event focused on the **Uzbek dance tradition of Lazgi**. We hosted four expert speakers at the Embassy of Uzbekistan, **Professor Ann R. David**, **Rosa Vercoe**, **Eva Skalla**, and **Dr Fariborz Kiannejad**. They were joined by a lovely, inquisitive audience with an interest in dance and performing arts.

His Excellency Said Rustamov, Ambassador of Uzbekistan in the United Kingdom, began the evening by extending a warm welcome to all our attendees. We then heard about the versatile styles of Uzbek dance, the origins and history of Lazgi, the body movements which are typical of this dance style, and the Ustoz-Shogird teaching method. The speakers also shared their impressions, images and photos of Khiva and the Lazgi Festival. In addition, Fariborz and Eva shared some fascinating images and videos taken at the Boysun Festival in Surkhandarya.


## RECENT ARTICLES ABOUT UZBEKISTAN

#### **EVENTS IN UZBEKISTAN**

On 22 July the long-awaited opening of the **Silk Road Samarkand** will take place. Built around the rowing canal, the development includes eight four- and five-star hotels, restaurants and shops, conference and event facilities, and the Eternal City historical complex, all powered by solar energy. The SCO Summit will be hosted here in September 2022, followed by the UNWTO General Assembly in November 2023.
