A message from Rev Paul

This week the government announced, as expected, that churches will return to worship from 4th July onwards. I know many people are expectant to hear when we can be open, so I just wanted to let you know the procedure for this. Obviously when the pandemic first hit and lockdown commenced there was no blueprint for how decisions were made, but it is now a fairly well organised process:

- The government made the decision to relax/tighten lockdown procedures for churches.
- Several days later the government issue guidelines for churches on that decision.
- The Church of England then study these guidelines and make any necessary additions and amendments before passing it onto our diocese.
- Our diocesan Bishops then adapt it for local use, add their own comments and distribute them to all incumbents, church wardens and licensed lay ministers. They also post in on the diocesan website.

In our benefice, I then meet with the church wardens and our office manager Georgina to discuss the guidelines and a possible way forward. These decisions are to be made jointly between the parish priest and PCC so this initial meeting with wardens is essential to get things started.

Once some options have been discussed, a proposal is sent to the PCC and at the moment this is via email for agreement or a Zoom meeting is arranged. In the early stages of lockdown this decision was made by a standing committee on behalf of the PCC, but as things have continued it is becoming important that we involve the whole PCC whenever possible.

As you can see, for this reason we cannot make quick decisions and I don't think that would be sensible given the safety aspect and the desire to provide services that are effective. As well as following this process, we have to ensure that we can both organise and staff anything that we do to ensure services can be held safely.

That said, I am very excited about the prospect of going back to worship in our buildings! We are going to continue with the Zoom and radio services for the foreseeable future as we acknowledge that many people won't be able to come to begin with anyway. Please keep a look out on our website or Facebook page for the latest information. *Rev Paul*
