This is the first of hopefully many newsletters that you will receive from us to keep you in the loop what is happening over here at What's Your Baseline.

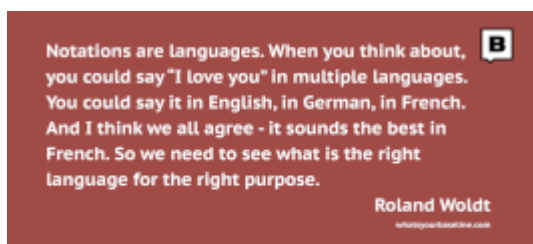
The first major change for the original subscribers is that we have migrated to a "professional" email system which allows to send more professional looking notes to you, and simplify our email management.

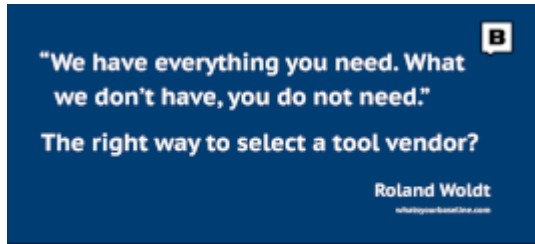
Episode 5 - Notations, notations, notations

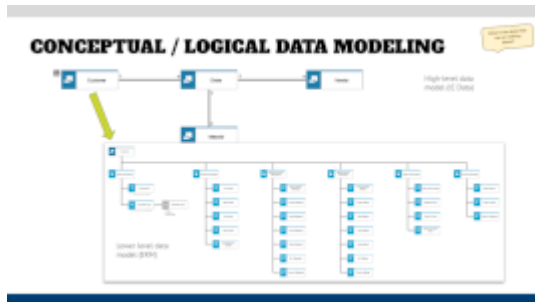

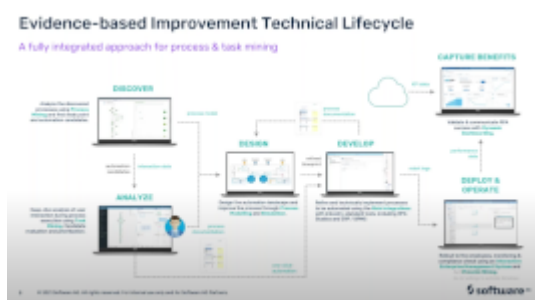

How to model data (part 1) - why should I care and what we are talking about

Data models are some of the things that I have seen the least often in projects over the last two decades. Why is that? Is it because it is too geeky, or not interesting enough compared to, say, a process model in BPMN?
