I hope that this newsletter finds you well at the end of another tumultuous year. Even though 2021 was better than 2020, it is time that you-know-what disappears and we all can go back to normal.


However 2021 has also seen some good things:

- After 14 years of procrastinating, three domains, and one domain expiration, I
 finally became serious with restarting the What's Your Baseline? website, and more
 than 2,900 page views by over 1,300 visitors (as of the time of this writing in midDecember) show that there is a demand for content about Enterprise Architecture
 and Business Process Management.
- We currently have 46 articles published and will get close to the 50 by the end of the year. We've seen one <u>guest post</u> and will onboard another guest author within the next days (and have him on the podcast next year as well no pressure, Caspar).
- The podcast started in August and in late November we broke the 1,000 downloads milestone (we are at 1,330 now two weeks later).

One reason for this growth might be that we did quite a push in getting the
podcast out there into the various directories and in as many ears as possible.
 Currently we are available on 25 platforms (the 24 below and I just learned from a
reader email that you can find us on Audible too).

One thing that I've noticed is that since we are on Apple Podcasts the download numbers go up, and the iPhone shows up as one of the leading devices it seems that for podcasting all things still go through Apple \(^\(\(\)\)\(_\)\(^-\)
- Speaking of renovations we enabled our website to be a "Progessive Web App",
 which means when you visit the page on a Chromium-based browser (Chrome, Edge)
 you will see a small "install" icon in the address bar. This allows you to create an
 "app" that has content locally cached on your machine (computer, tablet, phone),
 and it opens in its own window and even has an icon that can be added to the task
 bar.
- In addition to this we built a nice <u>community on LinkedIn</u> that has over 180 followers and is actively giving us feedback. Come join us over there as well.
- *And* we appeared on one <u>podcast as guests</u> (see also below) and were invited as <u>panelists on a webinar</u> earlier this quarter. In addition to that, the next guest appearances are already in the works.
- Lastly we started building a "resources" section behind the scenes and started a shop at Gumroad that we'll use to sell accelerators for your architecture program (the first one is a "name your price" offer).

Additional ideas besides the accelerators are also in the works, but it is too early to tell, so stay tuned and watch out when we go live with the new section on the website :-)

The end is near!



Business processes - how to structure your process view?


Setting up a <u>structure for your architecture</u> can be challenging when you want to include the demands of all stakeholders and cover all use cases. For some architectural views it is easy – applications typically come in "flat" and might just have one level below in your <u>meta model</u> (for components and other viewpoints), or risks and controls are typically already categorized before they are imported into an architecture tool.

Finding the right structure for your business processes can be tricky, though – various demands and opinions might come together that conflict each other. On the one hand, you have the business units who want to improve a process 'soup to nuts', while others have a specific focus on regulatory compliance, and others are even looking at processes from a functional perspective. Or, in some projects, all three aspects come to play, which obviously can lead to confusion or short-term decisions that will haunt you long after the project has ended.

This two-part article series will cover all three aspects and give you a recommendation how to handle this in your architecture and database structure.

Podcast - Process Mining: The Hipster Child of the Process Industry

"Today we talk with Roland Woldt, Washington, DC, and J-M Erlendson, Toronto. Both are working at Software AG as Business Process and Transformation Architects and are also running their own website (and podcast) at whatsyourbaseline.com, where they demystify and explain enterprise architecture.

Our topic today is process mining. As Roland puts it: like footprints in the snow executing processes leave process traces in application systems. And with process mining we can analyze these process traces to discover the underlying processes. We will learn how this works in reality, what a company needs to use this successfully and how it is connected to artificial intelligence. We will also talk about process lifecycle, process mining analysis and how it is connected to task mining and RPA."
