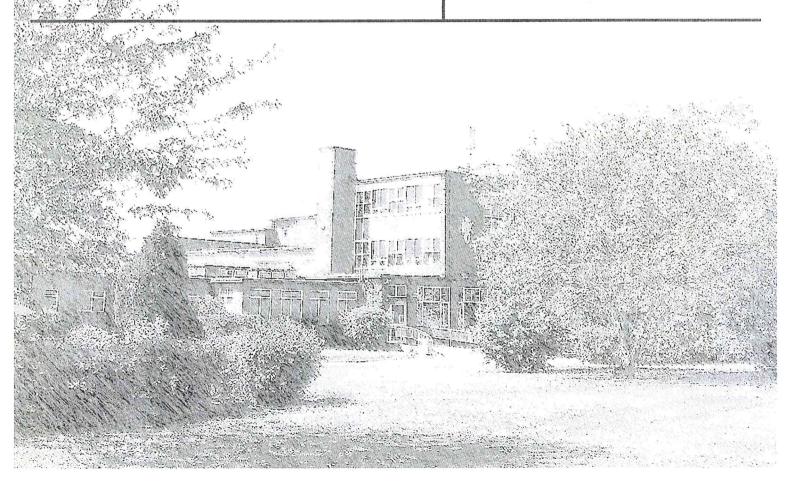


# Provider Access Policy

#### Introduction

This statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to the school and our students for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

#### Student entitlement

All students in years 8 to 13 are entitled to:

- find out about technical education, qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options events, assemblies, group discussions and taster events.
- understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

For pupils of compulsory school age these encounters are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 to 9) and two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 to 11). For pupils in the 'third key phase' (year 12 to 13), particularly those that have not yet decided on their next steps, there are two more provider encounters available during this period, which are optional. (Bold text is a quote from Provider Access Legislation)

These encounters with providers will be scheduled during the main school hours and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

- share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers
- explain what career routes those options could lead to
- provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (including the opportunity to meet staff and learners from the provider)
- answer questions from students.

#### Meaningful provider encounters

One encounter is defined as one meeting / session between students and one provider. We are committed to providing meaningful encounters to all pupils using the Making it Meaningful checklist.

#### Premises and facilities

The school will make available one of the halls, classrooms or private meeting rooms for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a member of their team.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course information in the Careers Section of the Library which is maintained by the Careers Coordinator. The Library is available to students at break, lunchtime and after school.
