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Introduction

Studienkolleg **prepares** applicants with a school-leaving certificate from abroad to study in Germany since some school-leaving certificates do not have a university entrance qualification in Germany.

Studienkolleg consists of **two academic semesters** or a **full academic year**

Reasons for the missing university entrance qualification

- School system
- The teaching contents
- The duration of school attendance

Reasons might be a bit different in Germany.

Official Studienkolleg

Official Studienkollegs are usually **tuition-free** and their **degree** is usually **valid to study anywhere in Germany**

Type of official studienkollegs:

-University studienkolleg:

Students can study after finishing Studienkollegs at the **university** and Hochschule (**University of applied science**)

-Fachhochschul-Studienkolleg:

Students can study after finishing Studienkollegs at **university of applied science**

Cost for registration at official Studienkolleg:

- Between 100–400 euro
- Duration: 12 months (two semesters)

Language of teaching:
German

Number of Studienkollegs:

There are 16 Studienkollegs in Germany

Courses at the Official Studienkolleg



University Studienkolleg **specialized courses:**

- **M-course:** for medical, biological, and pharmaceutical degrees
- **T-course:** for mathematical, science, or technical degrees
- **W-course:** for business, economics, and social science degrees
- **G-course:** for humanity degrees of German studies
- **S-course:** for language degrees

University of applied sciences **specialized courses:**

- **TI-course:** for technical and engineering degrees
- **WW-course:** for economics and business degrees
- **GD-course:** for design and art degrees
- **SW-course:** for social science degrees

Feststellungsprüfung (FSP)

FSP determines the suitability of the international applicants without HSP for studying at universities or universities of applied science in Germany. All official studienkollegs offer FSP two times per year.

Students at studienkollegs make the FSP after finishing the second semester



TYPES OF FSP

INTERN FSP:

Students at studienkollegs make the FSP after finishing the second semester

- **Passing chance over 80 %**

EXTERN FSP:

People who learn externally at private Studienkolleg or alone can make the FCP as an extern participant at the official studienkolleg or at the Land (Ex. Land NRW in Köln)

Participant has the chance two times per year to make the FSP

- **Passing Chance about 20 %**

Private Studienkolleg

Private Studienkolleg (Courses in German):

- Fees: Between 3.000 Euro – 12.000 Euro

Private Studienkolleg (Courses in English):

- Fees: 12,000 Euro – 17,000 Euro
- Duration: 8 to 12 Months
- No Entrance exam
- T and W Courses

Note:

Some private Studienkolleg does not offer valid certificates in all of Germany, therefore students must apply with the help of their school to an external Feststellungsprüfung at an official Studienkolleg

AVOIDING STUDIENKOLLEGS

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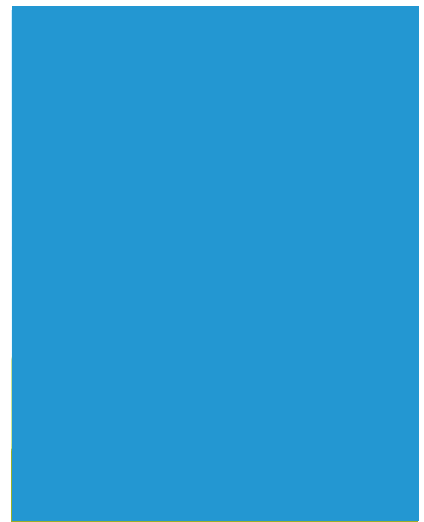
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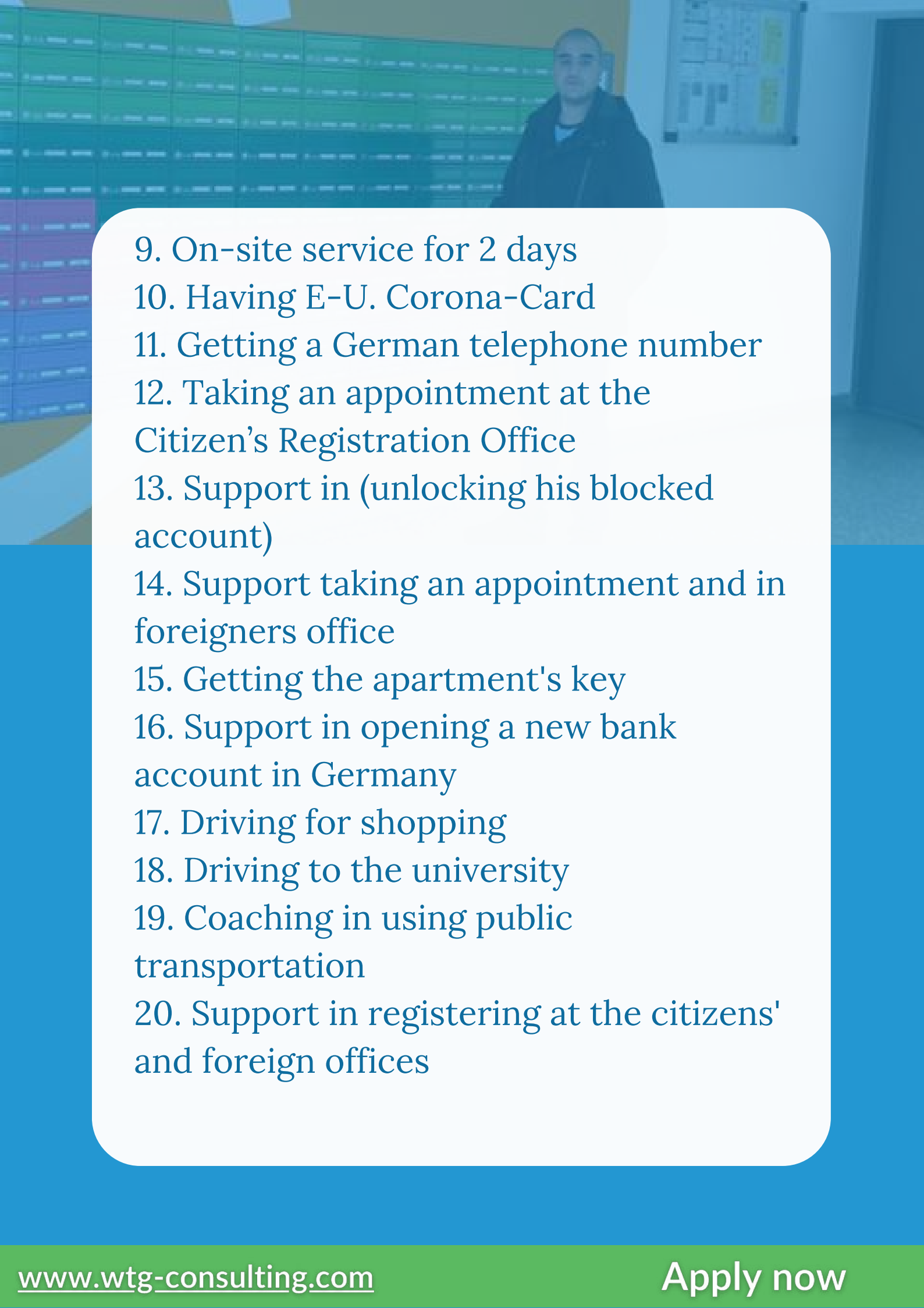
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
