

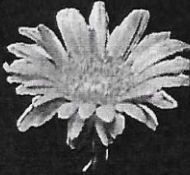

The Society's Next Three Shows at Yatton Village Hall

Summer: Saturday July 26th

Autumn: Saturday October 18th

Spring 2026: Saturday March 21st

Daffodil classifications & Colour codes

All daffodils are classified into one of 13 Divisions. The hybrid cultivars are Divs 1-12 and daffodils distinguished solely by botanical name are Div 13. There are also 6 main colour codes.



Division 1 trumpet

One flower to a stem; corona (trumpet) as long as, or longer than the perianth segments (petals)



Division 2 large cupped

One flower to a stem; corona more than one third, but less than equal to the length of the perianth



Division 3 small cupped

One flower per stem; corona not more than one third the length of the perianth segments.



Division 4 double

One or more flowers to a stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or corona or both.



Division 5 triandrus

Usually two or more pendant flowers to a stem; perianth segments reflexed



Division 6 cyclamineus

One flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem with very short neck.



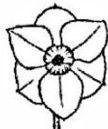
Division 7 jonquilla

One to five flowers per stem; perianth segments spreading or reflexed; corona cup-shaped, funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long and fragrant



Division 8 tazetta

Usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; perianth segments spreading not reflexed; flowers usually fragrant



Division 9 poeticus

Usually one flower to a stem; perianth pure white; corona very short or disc-shaped; usually green and / or yellow centre and a red rim. Flowers usually fragrant



Division 10 bulbocodium

Usually one flower per stem; perianth segments insignificant compared with the dominant corona.



Division 11 split corona

Corona split – usually for more than half its length.

- a) Collar
- b) Papillon

Division 12 other

Daffodil cultivars which do not fit into the definition of any of the other 11 divisions

Division 13 species

Daffodils distinguished solely by botanical name. All species and wild or reputedly wild variants and hybrids

Colour codes

W - white or whitish
 Y - yellow
 G - green
 R - red
 P - pink
 O - orange

When looking at a daffodil classification, the first number indicates the division of the daffodil – Div 1 is a trumpet. The first letters represent the petal (perianth) colour, which may be more than one. The next group of letters represent the corona colour which again may be more than one eg Div 1 y-gw = trumpet with yellow petals green centre and white corona

SHOW TIMETABLE

Entries should be on the official entry form printed in the show schedule and be submitted not later than 5.00 p.m. on the Thursday immediately preceding the show and handed in to any of the names on the entry form. **Please note no late entries will be accepted.**

ON THE DAY OF THE SPRING SHOW

8.30 until 10.30 am: Hall open to exhibitors who must collect their class cards from the show table as they enter the hall. Cards must be placed face down by each exhibit. Ask a steward for help if in doubt.

10.30 am Judging commences.

2.00 pm: Hall opens to the public.

3.00 pm to 4.00 pm: Prize money may be collected from the treasurer's table on the stage

4.15 pm: Presentation of trophies and awards after which the show closes and exhibits may then be removed. Any exhibit not removed by 5.00 pm shall be assumed to have been donated to the society

SOCIETY SHOW RULES

The Committee particularly requests that all exhibitors read these rules with care. Points for trophies are awarded thus – 1st: 3 pts; 2nd: 2pts; 3rd: 1 pt. In the event of a tie the person having the most firsts will be judged the winner.

1. All classes are open to everyone unless otherwise stated in the show schedule.

2. All plants, flowers, fruit and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor and have been in their possession for at least two months, except in the decorative and any children's flower classes.

3. Exhibitors may NOT enter more than two exhibits in any one class and can only win one prize. Exhibits in the child and adult handicraft classes must not have previously been exhibited in any Yatton and District Horticultural Show.

4. Exhibitors shall pay a fee of 20p per entry in all adult classes unless otherwise stated. Children's classes are free to enter.

5. Judges decision will be final. When a judge so decides, not all prizes will be awarded in any one class. Judging will be in accordance with the appropriate current rules in the RHS Handbook.

6. The committee will take all reasonable care of exhibits but will not be responsible for any damage from any cause whatsoever, or for injuries sustained.

7. The trophies are held for one year by the winner and returned to Maureen Clissold one month before the next annual show.

It is not necessary to show leaves with cut flowers, but if any foliage is shown, daffodil leaves must be used.

- 20 1 bloom, 1 vase W - Y or Yellow in cup

DIVISION 3 – Small Cup

One flower to a stem. Cup not more than one-third of the length of the petals.

DIVISION 4 – Doubles

One or more flowers to a stem. Clustered cup, petals or both.

- 30 3 bloom, 1 vase, any variety or varieties

DIVISION 5 – Triandus

Two or more flowers to a stem. Head drooping, petals often reflexed

DIVISION 6 – Cyclamineus

One flower at an acute angle to the stem. Cup straight and narrow, petals significantly reflexed

- 33 1 stem, 1 vase
- 34 3 stems, 1 vase

DIVISION 7 – Jonquilla

One to five (usually fragrant) flowers to a stem. Cup usually wider than long, petals spreading or reflexed

- 35 1 stem, 1 vase
- 36 3 stems, 1 vase

DIVISION 8 – Tazetta

Three to twenty flowers to a stout stem, very short cupped, petals spreading, not reflexed, usually fragrant.

- 37 1 stem, 1 vase
- 38 3 stems, 1 vase

DIVISION 9 – Poeticus

- 39 1 stem, 1 vase
- 40 3 stems, 1 vase

DIVISION 11 – Split Corona

41 1 bloom, 1 vase

Exhibits may be completely or partially arranged at home and transported by the exhibitor, or may be arranged in the hall prior to commencement of judging at 10.30 a.m. Judging will be under NAFAS rules, a copy of which will be available at the show.

65 “Arrangement featuring five seasonal flowers with foliage” in a space 45cms/18” wide

66 “Arrangement in a sugar bowl ” in a space 45cms/18” wide

HEMOCRAFT CLASSES

PHOTOGRAPHY CLASSES

Maximum size including borders or mounts is 225mm x 205mm / 10 x 8 ins. No frames. No exhibitor may have more than two entries in any one class.


