#### **Our Strategy**

At Ysgol Melyd we are careful to make the improvement journey a positive, honest one to approach our practise, allowing us to celebrate our successes whilst working on areas we need to develop.

As a learning community we are determined to challenge ourselves to improve in all that we do. We understand that we must react to National policy changes whilst at the same time not losing sight of our own local priorities and the needs of our individual learners. We also recognise that we must work collaboratively to achieve our goals, and therefore all of our actions identified in this plan will take place within a climate of collaboration, openness to change and a willingness to learn or lead – attitudes and behaviours which we, as a learning organisation, need to model for our own learners.

The development of high-quality, teaching and learning is, of course, at the heart of what we do at Ysgol Melyd. We are keen to share our strengths, as well as improve our areas of weakness, and continually strive for highly effective teaching, well-developed learning behaviours and building a climate of innovation, trust and excitement about learning. ## Improving the academic outcomes of learners

Through consideration of our current curriculum offer we have identified that despite having extensive school-grounds, we need to further develop our outdoor learning provision over the course of the next few years. In the first instance we will work in partnership with external organisations to build staff confidence and competence, including using award schemes to provide a structure, followed by a phase of experimentation where staff weave outdoor learning activities into their routine curriculum offer, sharing their successes and failures with colleagues in a supportive and open environment.

## Positive Impact!

With improved outdoor learning provision, we expect greater levels of engagement, more effective embedding of knowledge, skills and understanding, and subsequent improvement in academic outcomes as well as levels of self-esteem and social behaviours. There are also a number of learners who find it difficult to concentrate in the classroom. Opening their classroom to the outdoors would not only improve their academic opportunities, it would also improve their overall mental health and well-being.

The first step towards living in a more sustainable way is to be aware of what you currently do. That awareness will, in turn, make you more conscious of the choices you make in the future.





#### Broaden Their Horizons






## The Vision...







#### Prospective Kitchen Garden

Whilst utilising our current space, including the already positioned shed, green house and fruit trees. Our aim is to enhance the area by levelling off the area and building raised planters with hard standing paths creating a safe, sustainable, all year round area providing opportunities for everyone to learn life skills throughout the seasons whilst growing a range of produce for our cooking sessions and also donate to the local food bank.



#### Prospective Story Bowl

We're looking to create a nature trail with a difference, that will include a central location with several paths designed and sponsored by various parties which forms the shape of a sun leading to all the different areas for the ultimate learning experience and perfect location for our outdoor activities which include research for projects focusing on habitats, orienteering tasks, hunts, identifying scavenger plants, den building and much more.

#### How Can You Help?!

We recognise that we must work collaboratively to achieve our goals, with that said, we are looking for several third parties to get involved with our projects to help with labour, materials and/or funding. We have already secured funding from a local contractor who sub contracts to a local housing association and together we're hoping to create a community benefit scheme for the good of the school.

Ysgol Melyd have prepared a "Let's Go Wild" programme for pupils to raise initial funds via sponsorship, pupils are tasked with walking as many miles as they can throughout June/July for the Wildlife Trusts Annual Nature Challenge with prizes to be won including designing one of the paths in the Story Bowl.

We recognise that the summer holidays for some children is tough going, so we plan to put together a summer camp to be run in holidays whereby children can spend time outdoors helping with the projects detailed.
